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WHEREAS, in 2010, Arkansas had the 25th highest drug overdose mortality rate in the United States, with twelve and five-tenths (12.5) per one hundred thousand (100,000) people suffering drug overdose fatalities and prescription drugs are most frequently named in drug-related death certificates; and

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WHEREAS, prescription drug overdoses account for at least one (1) death per day in Arkansas; and

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WHEREAS, the number of drug overdose deaths in Arkansas, a majority of which are from prescription drugs, has more than doubled since 1999 when the rate was four and four-tenths (4.4) per one hundred thousand (100,000) people; and

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WHEREAS, Arkansas ranks 5th in the nation in the percentage of people



1 twelve (12) years of age or older who used prescription pain relievers for
2 nonmedical purposes in 2012-2013, with twenty-two percent(22%) of high school
3 students taking prescription drugs without a doctor's prescription in 2008;

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6 WHEREAS, in 2010, Arkansas had the nation's 12th highest rate of
7 prescription painkillers sold; and

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9 WHEREAS, the misuse of prescription drugs can have dire consequences,
10 and the rapid rise of abuse requires a full-scale response from healthcare
11 providers, law enforcement, educators, public officials, and the Arkansas
12 community; and

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14 WHEREAS, the people of Arkansas have a duty to educate our communities,
15 protect our medications at home, properly dispose of unwanted or unneeded
16 medications, promote responsible prescribing and dispensing of prescription
17 medications, encourage proper safeguarding of prescription medication
18 inventories, and help those struggling to overcome prescription drug
19 addictions,

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21 NOW THEREFORE,

22 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FIRST GENERAL
23 ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

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25 THAT the House of Representatives encourages the continued
26 collaboration between healthcare providers, law enforcement, educators,
27 public officials, and the Arkansas community in battling the abuse of
28 prescription drugs in Arkansas.
