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6	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 20-76-703(d)(1), concerning the		
7	administration of the Drug Screening and Testing Act of 2015, is amended to		
8	read as follows:		
9	(d)(l) An applicant or recipient shall undergo a confirmation test		
10	using the same <u>urine</u> <u>specimen</u> sample from the initial positive test prior to		
11	receiving Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Program benefits.

13	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code $\$$ 20-76-704(a)(2)-(4), concerning the duties		
14	of the Department of Workforce Services, is amended to read as follows:		
15	(2) Develop appropriate screening techniques and processes to		
16	establish reasonable cause that an applicant or recipient is using a drug and		
17	to establish the necessary criteria to permit the department to require the		
18	applicant or recipient to undergo <u>no less than</u> a urine-based five-panel drug		
19	test;		
20	(3) Identify and select a screening tool as a part of the development		
21	of the screening technique that will be employed for the pilot drug screening		
22	and testing program under this subchapter;		
23	(4) Develop a plan for funding of the costs of the screening process,		
24	the urine based <u>no less than</u> five-panel drug testing process, personnel and		
25	information systems modification, and other costs associated with the		
26	development and implementation of the testing process; and

28	SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 20-76-704(b), concerning the report by the		
29	Department of Workforce Services on the Drug Screening and Testing Act of		
30	2015, is amended to read as follows:		
31	(b) Upon conclusion of the first year of the pilot program and		
32	conclusion of the pilot program Annually, the department shall submit a		
33	report on or before December 31 to the General Assembly that includes without		
34	limitation:		
35	(1) The number of individuals screened;

- 2 (3) The number of screened individuals who took a drug test;
- 3 (4) The number of screened individuals who refused to take a

- 8 result on the drug test;
- 9 (7) The number of individuals who received a positive result on
- 10 a drug test for a second or subsequent time; and
- 11 (8) The amount of costs incurred by the department for the
- 12 administration of the pilot drug screening and testing program; and
- 13 (9) The number of applications and re-applications received for
- 14 the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Program, § 20-76-101 et seq., in
- 15 the previous year and the current year.

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- 17 SECTION 5. The introductory language of Arkansas Code § 20-76-705,
- 18 concerning the standards in the drug screening and testing program, is
- 19 amended to read as follows:

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- 23 SECTION 6. Arkansas Code § 20-76-705(5)(A) and (B), concerning the
- 24 standards in the drug screening and testing program, is amended to read as
- 25 follows:
- 26 (5)(A) A requirement that an applicant or recipient be tested
- 27 using the urine based no less than five-panel drug test upon the conclusion
- 28 of the determined treatment period.
- 29 (B) If an applicant or recipient receives a positive
- 30 result on the urine based no less than five-panel drug test or any subsequent
- 31 drug test, the applicant shall be ineligible for program benefits for six (6)
- 32 months.

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- 34 SECTION 7. Arkansas Code § 20-76-709 is amended to read as follows:
