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3	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the		
4	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that this exemption is needed for		
5	the security of the State Capitol Building and Capitol Hill apartment		
6	complex; that this act protects confidential records belonging to the State		
7	Capitol Police; and that this act is immediately necessary because currently		
8	this exemption does not exist in law. Therefore, an emergency is declared to		
9	exist, and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the		
10	public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:		
11	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
12	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,		
13	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the		
14	<u>bill; or</u>		
15	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is		
16	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
