- 1 101(16)(A) and Arkansas Code § 17-92-101(16)(A)(i), concerning the definition 2 of "practice of pharmacy" within the laws concerning pharmacists and 3 pharmacies, is amended to read as follows: 4 (16)(A) "Practice of pharmacy" means the <del>learned</del> <u>healthcare</u> 5 provider profession of: 6 (i)(a) Dispensing, selling, distributing, 7 transferring possession of, vending, bartering, or, in accordance with 8 regulations adopted by the Arkansas State Board of Pharmacy, administering 9 drugs, medicines, poisons, or chemicals that under the laws of the United 10 States or the State of Arkansas may be sold or dispensed only on the prescription and order of a practitioner authorized by law to prescribe 11 12 drugs, medicines, poisons, or chemicals. 13 (b) Except in accordance with regulations 14 adopted by the Arkansas State Board of Pharmacy as recommended by the 15 Medications Administration Advisory Committee, the administration of 16 medications shall be limited to the following classifications of medications: 17 immunizations, vaccines, allergy medications, vitamins, minerals, 18 antihyperglycemics, and antinausea medications Except as limited by rules 19 adopted by the Arkansas State Board of Pharmacy, a pharmacist has the ability 20 to administer medications. 21 (c) Influenza vaccines and influenza 22 immunizations may be administered to a person seven (7) years of age and 23 older under a general written protocol. 24 (d) Vaccines and immunizations other than 25 influenza vaccines and influenza immunizations may be administered to a 26 person from seven (7) years of age to eighteen (18) years of age under a 27 patient-specific order or prescription and subject to reporting of the 28 administration to the prescribing physician together with any reporting 29 required under § 20-15-1203. 12	to pharmacists and pharmacies, is amended to add an additional subdivision to			
13	read as follows:			
14	(24) "Statewide protocol" means a standardized procedure or			
15	protocol approved by the Arkansas State Board of Pharmacy and the Arkansas			
16	State Medical Board authorizing a pharmacist to initiate therapy and			
17	administer or dispense, or both, a drug or device.

19	SECTION 4. Arkansas Code Title 17, Chapter 92, Subchapter 1, is			
20	amended to add an additional section to read as follows:			
21	17-92-115. Requirements for administering and dispensing without a			
22	diagnosis.			
23	When initiating therapy and administering or dispensing, or both, unde			
24	§ 17-92-101, a pharmacist shall:			
25	(1) Notify the primary care provider of the patient of any drug			
26	or device furnished to the patient or enter the appropriate information in a			
27	patient record system shared with the primary care provider, as permitted by			
28	the primary care provider;			
29	(2) Provide the patient with a written record of the drugs or			
30	devices furnished and advise the patient to consult a physician of the			
31	patient's choice, if the patient does not have a primary care provider; and			
32	(3)(A) Make a standardized fact sheet available to the recipient			
33	of the drug or device.			
34	(B) The standardized fact sheet shall include without			
35	limitation:			
36	(i) The indications and contraindications for the			

1	use of the drug or device;		
2	(ii) The appropriate method for the use of the drug		
3	or device;		
4	(iii) The need for medical follow-up; and		
5	(iv) Other appropriate information.		
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7	SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 17-95-102(d)(4), concerning physician		
8	dispensing of legend drugs, is amended to read as follows:		
9	(4) A prescription for a topical medication, Naloxone, or
