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25	SECTION 1. DO NOT CODIFY.	Legislative findings.	
26	(a) The General Assembly f	inds that:	
27	(1) The Delta Region	al Authority operates a pr	rogram in
28	partnership with the federal Inno	vative Readiness Training	within the United
29	States Department of Defense;		
30	(2) This program offe	ers free medical, dental,	optical, and
31	veterinary care to the medically	underserved and communition	es with high
32	poverty rates in the forty-two (4	2) counties that are serve	ed by the Delta
33	Regional Authority;		
34	(3) The program prov	ides free medical, dental	, optical, and
35	veterinary care periodically at l	ocal venues in the Delta	region;
36	(4) The healthcare p	rofessionals who participa	ate in the program

1	are military medical staff who are licensed in their respective fields;
2	(5) Often, these healthcare professionals licensed in their
3	respective fields are not licensed to practice within the State of Arkansas;

5	(6) In order to participate in the program, the healthcare
6	professionals must obtain temporary licensure from their respective boards in
7	Arkansas, which can cause delays and barriers to offering free medical,
8	dental, optical, and veterinary care under the program.
9	(b) It is the intent of the General Assembly to standardize and
10	streamline the licensing process to authorize healthcare professionals
11	licensed in other states, commonwealths, territories, or the District of
12	Columbia to practice while offering free medical, dental, optical, and
13	veterinary care through a program in partnership with the federal Innovative
14	Readiness Training.
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16	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 17-81-302 is amended to read as follows:
17	17-81-302. Exempted activities.
18	Nothing herein shall be construed to This chapter does not prohibit or
19	to require a license hereunder with respect to any of the following acts:
20	(1) The performance of services in case of an emergency;
21	(2) $\underline{(A)}$ The performance of services in this state on an
22	occasional basis, limited to ninety (90) days in each calendar year, by a
23	chiropractor lawfully practicing chiropractic in another state or territory.
24	(B) However, if any such <u>a</u> chiropractor performs services
25	on a regular basis, or for his or her regular use maintains or is provided
26	with any office or other place to meet persons for the performance of such
27	services in the State of Arkansas, he or she shall obtain a license to
28	practice chiropractic in the State of Arkansas; or
29	(3) The practice of medicine and surgery, osteopathy, dentistry,

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20	SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 17-90-102 is amended to read as follows:	
21	17-90-102. Exemptions.	
22	Nothing in this chapter, except as expressly provided otherwise, shall	
23	apply This chapter does not:	
24	(1) Apply to physicians and surgeons nor to persons who sell	
25	eyeglasses, spectacles, lenses, contact lenses, frames, mountings, or prisms	
26	at wholesale on individual prescriptions to optometrists, physicians, and	
27	surgeons, nor shall it prohibit;	
28	(2) Prohibit the sale of ready-made eyeglasses and spectacles

Arkansas Code § 17-101-307(b), concerning exemptions to 15 licensure under the Arkansas Veterinary Medical Practice Act, is amended to 16 add an additional subdivision to read as follows: 17 (11) The practice of veterinary medicine through a program in
- 18 partnership with the federal Innovative Readiness Training if the 19 veterinarian or veterinary technician has obtained a license to practice from 20 another state, commonwealth, territory, or the District of Columbia.

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SECTION 10. Arkansas Code § 17-105-106 is amended to read as follows: 23 17-105-106. Exemption from licensure.

Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to This chapter does not require licensure of:

- (1) A physician assistant student enrolled in a physician assistant or surgeon assistant educational program accredited by the Committee on Allied Health Education and Accreditation or by its successor agency;
- 30 (2) A physician assistant employed in the service of the federal 31 government while performing duties incident to that employment;
- 32 Technicians, other assistants, or employees of physicians 33 who perform delegated tasks in the office of a physician but who are not 34 rendering services as a physician assistant or identifying themselves as a 35 physician assistant;
- 36 (4) A physician assistant in the service of the State Military

1	Department or the Arkansas National Guard, or both. These physician
2	assistants shall be allowed to perform their physician assistant practice
3	duties, including prescribing, in the same manner as they would if
4	federalized by the United States Government; or
5	(5) A physician assistant who is temporarily transiting through
6	the State of Arkansas while caring for a patient, provided that he or she
7	remains under the supervision of his or her supervising physician; or
8	(6) A physician assistant providing services through a program
9	in partnership with the federal Innovative Readiness Training if the
10	physician assistant has obtained a license to practice from another state,
11	commonwealth, territory, or the District of Columbia.
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
