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34		ERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and detern	
35	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that insufficient research and data		
36	exist on the ability of the writing portion of the ACT Aspire assessment to		



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accurately measure the academic performance of a student, public school, or public school district; that more time is needed to gather research and data		
to determine whether the writing portion of the ACT Aspire assessment is an		
appropriate assessment to make that measurement; and that this act is		
immediately necessary to ensure that the Department of Education does not		
consider a student's score on the writing portion of the ACT Aspire		
assessment in measuring the academic performance of a student, public school,		
or public school district during the 2016-2017 school year. Therefore, an		
emergency is declared to exist, and this act being immediately necessary for		
the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become		
effective on:		
(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,		
the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the		
bill; or		
(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is		
overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.		

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
