31	SECTION 2. EM	MERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and deter	mined by the
32	General Assembly of	the State of Arkansas that the operation	ons of the Arkansas
33	Public Employees' Re	etirement System are complex; that the	system must be able
34	to meet the needs of	its members as anticipated by the Gen	eral Assembly; that
35	certain provisions o	of § 24-4-101 et seq. are imminently in	need of revision
36	and updating to brin	ng the operations of the system into co	nformance with

1	sound public pension policy; that this act will enable members of the system
2	to obtain benefits in a more time efficient manner; and that this act is
3	immediately necessary because it will allow the system to align its standard
4	of practice with the provisions of the act and thereafter expediently address
5	the needs of its members. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and
6	this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public
7	peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:
8	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
9	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
10	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
11	bill; or
12	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
13	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
