- 24 this Section at any time during the fiscal year when it is determined by the
- 25 Chancellor of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences, subject to the
- 26 review and approval by the Board of Trustees, that the need for additional
- 27 positions exists. Only medical or research positions shall be established
- 28 under this provision. The Chancellor of the University of Arkansas for
- 29 Medical Sciences shall provide a quarterly report detailing the justification
- 30 of allocation of positions from this "Clinical Expansion and Research Pool"
- 31 to the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, to the Department of Higher
- 32 Education, and to the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee
- 33 for review. The report shall also include an accounting of the names, titles
- 34 and salaries of personnel who have been employed in positions established
- 35 from this pool and the source and duration of funds associated with the
- 36 positions.

- 1 (c) If the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences requests
 2 continuation of any "Clinical Expansion and Research Pool" position(s) as
 3 established herein during the next fiscal year, the position(s) must be
 4 requested as a new position(s) in the agency's budget request.
- 5 (d) Determining the number of personnel to be employed by a state agency 6 is the prerogative of the General Assembly and is usually accomplished by 7 delineating the maximum number of personnel by identifying job titles and the 8 maximum grade or salary attached to those titles. The General Assembly has 9 determined that the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences could be 10 operated more efficiently if some flexibility is given to that institution. 11 That flexibility is being accomplished by providing a position pool in 12 Subsection (a) of this Section and since the General Assembly has granted the 13 agency broad powers under the growth pool concept, it is both necessary and 14 appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight of the utilization 15 of the position pool by requiring review of the Legislative Council or Joint 16 Budget Committee in the utilization of the position pool. Therefore, the 17 requirement of review by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is 18 not a severable part of this section. If the requirement of review by the 19 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled unconstitutional by a 20 court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is void.
- The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, $\frac{2016}{20}$ 2017 through June 30, $\frac{2017}{2018}$.

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24 SECTION 43. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 25 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ON-CALL 26 COMPENSATION. On-call duty or standby duty differential may be authorized 27 for a Classified or Non-Classified patient care employee whose job requires 28 him or her to provide services when there is no regularly scheduled staff 29 coverage. An employee shall not exceed 128 hours during any seven-day 30 period, at rates of pay not to exceed those provided in the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act, or its successor, or this act for the 31 32 appropriate compensation.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, $\frac{2016}{2017}$ through June 30, $\frac{2017}{2018}$.

- 4 fiscal year to the Legislative Council on program activities and the
- 5 expenditure of funds from the Psychiatric Research Institute and Department
- 6 of Pediatrics appropriation for Building Effective Services for Trauma
- 7 programs for children and adolescents.
- 8 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2016
- 9 <u>2017</u> through June 30, 2017 <u>2018</u>.

- 11 SECTION 45. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
- 12 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ABUSED
- 13 CHILDREN AND ADOLESCENTS SERVICES PROGRAM FUNDING PROVISION. In the event
- 14 the amount of general revenue distributed to the University of Arkansas
- 15 Medical Center Fund for the Department of Pediatrics and the Psychiatric
- 16 Research Institute each fiscal year is at least equal to the amount
- 17 distributed during the 2012-13 fiscal year, an amount not less than seven
- 18 hundred thousand dollars (\$700,000) shall be allocated and made available as
- 19 follows: four hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$450,000) each fiscal year
- 20 shall be made available exclusively to support the purposes and goals to
- 21 improve screening, monitoring and care for abused children and adolescents
- 22 through the Child Safety Centers or the University of Arkansas for Medical
- 23 Sciences as referred by the Child Safety Centers. Maintenance of statewide
- 24 screening and assessment protocols as well as evidence-based training of
- 25 mental health professionals are to be considered critical components of the

SECTION 46. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied

Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

SECTION 48. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the

General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits
the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2017 is essential to the operation of
the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2017 could work irreparable harm
upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2017.
