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## Subtitle

14 AN ACT FOR THE UNIVERSITY OF ARKANSAS FOR  
15 MEDICAL SCIENCES APPROPRIATION FOR THE  
16 2017-2018 FISCAL YEAR.  
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20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
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22 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES - OPERATIONS. There is hereby established

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23 SECTION 2. EXTRA HELP - OPERATIONS. There is hereby authorized, for  
 24 the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences for the 2017-2018 fiscal  
 25 year, the following maximum number of part-time or temporary employees, to be  
 26 known as "Extra Help", payable from funds appropriated herein for such  
 27 purposes: six hundred twenty-five (625) temporary or part-time employees,  
 28 when needed, at rates of pay not to exceed those provided in the Uniform  
 29 Classification and Compensation Act, or its successor, or this act for the  
 30 appropriate classification.

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32 SECTION 3. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
 33 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EXTRA  
 34 HELP - UNIVERSITY HOSPITAL PRN POOL. There is hereby authorized, for the  
 35 University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences, the following number of part-  
 36 time or temporary positions, to be known as "PRN Extra Help", payable from

1 funds appropriated herein, for the purpose of employing RN's and LPN's in a  
 2 Nursing PRN Pool: four hundred ten (410), when needed, at rates of pay not  
 3 to exceed the rate of pay for comparable positions authorized by this Act.  
 4 If the agency requests continuation of a "PRN Extra Help" position(s) as  
 5 established herein during the next fiscal year, the extra help position(s)  
 6 must be requested as a new extra help position(s) in the agency's budget  
 7 request.

8 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2016~~  
 9 2017 through June 30, ~~2017~~ 2018.

 11 SECTION 4. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
 12 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EXTRA  
 13 HELP - UAMS TEMPS. There is hereby authorized for the University of Arkansas  
 14 for Medical Sciences, the following number of part-time or temporary  
 15 positions, to be known as "UAMS TEMPS/EXTRA HELP", payable from funds  
 16 appropriated herein, for the purpose of employing qualified individuals in a  
 17 UAMS Temporary Pool: five hundred thirty (530), when needed, at rates of pay  
 18 not to exceed the rate of pay for comparable positions authorized by this  
 19 Act.

20 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2016~~  
 21 2017 through June 30, ~~2017~~ 2018.

17 Medical Sciences. Individuals using this facility will be charged a daily  
18 rate as determined by the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences.

19 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2016~~  
20 2017 through June 30, ~~2017~~ 2018.

21  
22 SECTION 37. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
23 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CARRY  
24 FORWARD. Any unexpended balance of the general revenue funds provided by this  
25 Act which remains at the close of a fiscal year, not to exceed ten percent  
26 (10%) of funded appropriations, shall be carried forward and made available  
27 for the same purposes for the next fiscal year.

28 Any carry forward of unexpended balance of funding as authorized herein,  
29 may be carried forward under the following conditions:

30 (1) Prior to June 30, ~~2017~~ 2018 the Agency shall by written statement set

20 The University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences is hereby authorized to pay  
21 stipends to students engaged in post-graduate clinical training in accredited  
22 programs of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences, from "Regular  
23 Salaries" or "Maintenance and General Operation", as follows:

35 SECTION 39. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
36 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CHAPLAIN

1 HOUSING ALLOWANCE. The Chancellor of the University of Arkansas for Medical  
2 Sciences may designate up to forty-five percent (45%) of the regular gross  
3 salary (or stipend) of a minister or other clergy employed as a Chaplain or  
4 appointed as a Chaplain Resident, as a housing allowance, to the extent used  
5 by the person to rent or provide a home, according to the guidelines of the  
6 Internal Revenue Service Code, Section 107 and the Arkansas Code 26-51-  
7 404(b)(9).

27 not to exceed ~~\$293,550~~ \$302,356. These positions are to be used by the

2 FAMILY LIFE INSTITUTE. The Child Health and Family Life Institute shall be  
3 administered under the direction of Arkansas Children's Hospital. Arkansas  
4 Children's Hospital shall enter into a cooperative agreement and/or contract  
5 with the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences-Department of Pediatrics  
6 for services required to deliver the programs of the Child Health and Family  
7 Life Institute (CHFLI). Utilizing a multidisciplinary collaboration of  
8 professionals, CHFLI shall provide a statewide effort to explore, develop and  
9 evaluate new and better ways to address medically, socially and economically

23 FEES. On July 1 of each year the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences  
24 shall pay from the appropriation provided herein from non-general revenue,  
25 the total amount appropriated for War Memorial Stadium Commission Parking  
26 Services from Fees to the War Memorial Stadium Commission.

27 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2016~~  
28 2017 through June 30, ~~2017~~ 2018.

29

30 SECTION 44. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
31 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER  
32 PROVISIONS. Because the Rural Medical Practice Student Loan and Scholarship  
33 Program Loans and/or Scholarships and the Community Match Student Loan and  
34 Scholarship Program Loans and/or Scholarships have the goal of providing  
35 primary care physicians in rural Arkansas, transfers may be made in such  
36 amounts as are required between the line items made in the appropriation for

1 "Medical Loans and Scholarships".

2 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2016~~  
3 2017 through June 30, ~~2017~~ 2018.

4  
5 SECTION 45. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
6 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CLINICAL  
7 EXPANSION AND RESEARCH POOL. (a) In order to address personnel needs emerging  
8 from expanding medical research and patient care issues and the necessity of  
9 recruiting and retaining qualified medical, research, and related support  
10 personnel, the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences or its successor  
11 is authorized for the ~~2016-2017~~ 2017-2018 fiscal year a pool of seven hundred  
12 (700) "Clinical Expansion and Research Pool" positions. These positions are  
13 to be used by the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences in the event  
14 that the personal services needs resulting from unanticipated clinical or  
15 research programs that are initiated during the ~~2016-2017~~ 2017-2018 fiscal  
16 year require additional positions, either in title, in classification, or in  
17 number, that are not authorized or contemplated by the General Assembly in  
18 the Regular Salaries - Operations section of this Act.

19 (b) The University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences is authorized to

23 COMPENSATION. On-call duty or standby duty differential may be authorized  
24 for a Classified or Non-Classified patient care employee whose job requires  
25 him or her to provide services when there is no regularly scheduled staff  
26 coverage. An employee shall not exceed 128 hours during any seven-day  
27 period, at rates of pay not to exceed those provided in the Uniform  
28 Classification and Compensation Act, or its successor, or this act for the

35 PSYCHIATRIC RESEARCH INSTITUTE & DEPARTMENT OF PEDIATRICS REPORTS. The  
36 University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences shall report quarterly each

1 fiscal year to the Legislative Council on program activities and the  
2 expenditure of funds from the Psychiatric Research Institute and Department  
3 of Pediatrics appropriation for Building Effective Services for Trauma  
4 programs for children and adolescents.

5 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2016~~  
6 2017 through June 30, ~~2017~~ 2018.

7  
8 SECTION 48. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
9 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ABUSED  
10 CHILDREN AND ADOLESCENTS SERVICES PROGRAM FUNDING PROVISION. In the event  
11 the amount of general revenue distributed to the University of Arkansas  
12 Medical Center Fund for the Department of Pediatrics and the Psychiatric  
13 Research Institute each fiscal year is at least equal to the amount  
14 distributed during the 2012-13 fiscal year, an amount not less than seven  
15 hundred thousand dollars (\$700,000) shall be allocated and made available as  
16 follows: four hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$450,000) each fiscal year  
17 shall be made available exclusively to support the purposes and goals to  
18 improve screening, monitoring and care for abused children and adolescents  
19 through the Child Safety Centers or the University of Arkansas for Medical  
20 Sciences as referred by the Child Safety Centers. Maintenance of statewide  
21 screening and assessment protocols as well as evidence-based training of  
22 mental health professionals are to be considered critical components of the  
23 overall goals. For the provision of assessment and therapeutic services,  
24 these funds are to be provided to the Child Safety Centers through contracts  
25 from the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences. The contracts will  
26 stipulate the terms of the agreement and reporting requirements; an amount  
27 not to exceed fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) may be utilized for  
28 administrative costs as may be necessary to administer the program or if  
29 determined not to be needed for administrative costs may be placed in reserve  
30 for future needs of the program. The remaining two hundred thousand dollars  
31 (\$200,000) shall be allocated and made available to the Department of  
32 Pediatrics for expenses for medical examinations, consultation, education and  
33 training as stipulated in the terms of agreement between the Chancellor of  
34 the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences and the Department of  
35 Pediatrics.

36 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2016~~

1 2017 through June 30, ~~2017~~ 2018.

3 SECTION 49. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds  
4 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency  
5 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and  
6 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and  
7 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary  
8 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures  
9 Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this  
10 State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of  
11 Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied  
12 with in disbursement of said funds.

13

14 SECTION 50. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General  
15 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations  
16 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for  
17 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive  
18 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget  
19 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or  
20 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative  
21 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

22

23 SECTION 51. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the  
24 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits  
25 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the  
26 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2017 is essential to the operation of  
27 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in  
28 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the  
29 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2017 could work irreparable harm  
30 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental  
31 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act  
32 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health  
33 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2017.
