7	requires more than one hundred twenty (120) semester credit hours; or		
8	(ii) Is classified as a senior by the approved		
9	institution of higher education in which the recipient is enrolled.		
10	(2) A recipient is eligible to receive a maximum aggregate		
11	enhanced scholarship award of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) under		
12	subdivision (a)(1) of this section.		
13	(b) To be eligible for an enhanced scholarship award under subdivision		
14	(a)(1) of this section, a recipient shall:		
15	(1) Maintain a postsecondary grade point average of 3.0 or		
16	higher on a 4.0 scale at an approved institution of higher education;		
17	(2) Be enrolled in a teacher education program at a four-year		
18	approved institution of higher education; and		
19	(3)(A) Enter into a written agreement with the Department of		
20	Higher Education to teach at a public school for a minimum of five (5)		
21	consecutive years in a high-needs subject area as determined under		
22	subdivision (b)(3)(B) of this section.		
23	(B) A recipient shall be deemed to be teaching in a high-		
24	needs subject area if the subject area in which the recipient is employed to		
25	teach was determined by the Department of Education to be a high-needs		
26	subject area in:		
27	(i) The year the recipient entered into the		
28	agreement with the Department of Higher Education under subdivision		
29	(b)(3)(A);		
30	(ii) Any year the recipient received an enhanced		
31	scholarship award under this section; or		
32	(iii) The year the recipient is licensed as a		
33	teacher by the State Board of Education.		
34	(c) The written agreement entered into by the recipient and the		
35	Department of Higher Education under subdivision (b)(3) of this section shall		
36	provide that the recipient:		

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1	(1) Shall seek licensure as a teacher from the State Board of		
2	Education within one (1) year of completing the teacher education program and		
3	earning a degree; and		
4	(2) Shall repay the enhanced scholarship award amount:		
5	(A) On a pro rata basis at an interest rate and on a		
6	schedule as determined by the Department of Higher Education for each year		
7	the recipient does not teach at a public school in a high-needs subject area		
8	if the recipient does not teach at a public school in a high-needs subject		
9	area as determined by the Department of Education for five (5) consecutive		
10	years after first becoming employed as a licensed teacher; or		
11	(B) In its entirety at an interest rate and on a schedule		
12	as determined by the Department of Higher Education if the recipient does		
13	<pre>not:</pre>		
14	(i) Obtain licensure as a teacher from the State		
15	Board of Education within one (1) year of completing the teacher education		
16	program and earning a degree;		
17	(ii) Begin work at a public school as a licensed		
18	teacher in a high-needs subject area, as determined by the Department of		
19	Education, in the academic year immediately following becoming licensed; or		
20	(iii) Teach at a public school in a high-needs		
21	subject area as determined by the Department of Education in the recipient's		
22	first year as a licensed teacher.		
23	(d)(1) The Department of Higher Education may defer the requirements		
24	under subdivisions (c)(2)(B)(ii) and (iii) if the Department of Higher		
25	Education, in consultation with the Department of Education, determines that		
26	there was no employment position available at a public school that would		
27	reasonably enable the recipient to meet the requirements.		
28	(2) After the period of deferral, the recipient shall begin or		
29	resume teaching at a public school in a high-needs subject area or become		
30	subject to repayment under subdivision (c)(2) of this section.		
31	(e)(1) By March 1 of each year, the Department of Education shall		
32	provide to the Department of Higher Education a maximum on the number of		
33	enhanced scholarships that should be awarded under this section for the		
34	following academic year based on the projected needs of licensed teachers at		
35	public schools in high-needs subject areas.		
36	(2) The Department of Higher Education shall not award for an		

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1	academic year more enhanced scholarships than the maximum number provided by
2	the Department of Education under subdivision (e)(1) of this section.
3	(f) If the Department of Higher Education receives applications from
4	more qualified applicants than the number of enhanced scholarships available
5	or if funds are not available to award enhanced scholarships to all qualified
6	applicants, the Department of Higher Education shall award the enhanced
7	scholarships on a competitive basis as determined by the Department of Higher
8	Education.
9	(g) If a recipient of an enhanced scholarship under this section
10	withdraws from an approved institution of higher education so that under the
11	rules of that approved institution of higher education the recipient is
12	entitled to a refund of any tuition, fees, or other charges, the approved
13	institution of higher education shall pay the refund to which the recipient
14	may be entitled to the Department of Higher Education to the extent of any
15	amount the Department of Higher Education has paid to the recipient for that
16	academic year.
17	(h) The Department of Higher Education shall promulgate rules to
18	implement this section.
