17	TO REVISE THE CIRCUMSTANCES UNDER WHICH A
18	PUBLIC SCHOOL OR PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT
19	THAT HAS BEEN TAKEN OVER BY THE STATE FOR
20	BEING IN ACADEMIC DISTRESS CAN BE
21	RETURNED TO LOCAL CONTROL; AND TO DECLARE
22	AN EMERGENCY.
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25	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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27	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code \S 6-15-430(a)(7), concerning actions the
28	State Board of Education may take if a school district is classified as being
29	in academic distress, is amended to read as follows:
30	(7) Return the administration of the school district to the
31	former board of directors or to a newly elected board of directors <u>as</u>
32	provided in subsection (d) of this section if:
33	(A) The Department of Education certifies in Writing to
34	the state board and to the school district that the school district has
35	corrected all issues that caused the classification of academic distress; and
36	(B) The state board determines that the school district

1	has corrected all issues that caused the classification of academic distress;
2	and
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4	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 6-15-430(b)(10), concerning actions the
5	State Board of Education may take if a school district is classified as being
6	in academic distress, is amended to read as follows:
7	(10) Return the administration of the school district to the
8	former board of directors or to a newly elected board of directors <u>as</u>
9	provided in subsection (d) of this section if:
10	(A) The department certifies in writing to the state board
11	and to the school district that the public school has corrected all issues
12	that caused the classification of academic distress and that no public school
13	within the school district is classified as being in academic distress; and
14	(B) The state board determines the public school has
15	corrected all issues that caused the classification of academic distress and
16	that no public school within the school district is classified as being in
17	academic distress; and
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19	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 6-15-430(d)(2)(A), concerning academic
20	distress, is amended to read as follows:
21	(2)(A) If the state board determines that sufficient progress
22	has been made by a public school or school district in academic distress
23	toward correcting all issues that caused the classification of academic
24	distress, but the public school or school district has not yet resolved all
25	issues that caused the classification of academic distress, the The
26	commissioner, with the approval of the state board, may appoint a community
27	advisory board of either five (5) or seven (7) members to serve under the
28	supervision and direction of the commissioner <u>if the state board determines</u>
29	that sufficient progress has been made by a public school or school district
30	in academic distress toward correcting issues that caused the classification
31	of academic distress.
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33	SECTION 4. Arkansas Code \S 6-15-430(d)(2)(D), concerning the duties of
34	a community advisory board, is amended to read as follows:
35	(D) The duties of a community advisory board include
36	without limitation:

1	(i) Meeting monthly during a regularly scheduled
2	public meeting with the state-appointed administrator regarding the progress
3	of the public school or school district toward correcting all issues that
4	caused the classification of academic distress;
5	(ii) Seeking community input from the residents of
6	the school district regarding the progress of the public school or school
7	district toward correcting all issues that caused the classification of
8	academic distress;
9	(iii) Conducting hearings and making recommendations
10	to the commissioner regarding personnel and student discipline matters under
11	the appropriate district policies;
12	(iv) Working to build community capacity for the
13	continued support of the school district; and
14	(v) Submitting quarterly reports to the commissioner
15	and the state board regarding the progress of the public school or school
16	district toward correcting all issues that caused the classification of
17	academic distress.
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19	SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § $6-15-430(d)(3)(A)$, concerning academic
20	distress, is amended to read as follows:
21	(3)(A) By April 1 of each year following the appointment of a
22	community advisory board under subdivision (d)(2) of this section, the state
23	board shall determine the extent of the public school's or school district's
24	progress toward correcting all issues that caused the classification of
25	academic distress and shall:
26	(i) Allow the community advisory board to remain in
27	place for one (1) additional year;
28	(ii) Return the school district to local control by
29	calling for the election of a newly elected board of directors if:
30	(a) The department certifies in writing to the
31	state board and to the school district that:
32	<u>(1)</u> the <u>The</u> public school or school
33	district has corrected all issues that caused the classification of academic
34	distress and that no public school within the school district is classified
35	as being in academic distress <u>;</u>
36	(2) The public school or school district

1	has made sufficient progress on the issues that caused the classification of
2	academic distress such that the public school or school district should be
3	returned to the local control of its residents; or
4	(3) It is in the best interest of the
5	public school or school district to return the public school or school
6	district to the local control of its residents; and
7	(b) The state board determines:
8	$\underline{(1)}$ the \underline{The} public school or school
9	district has corrected all issues that caused the classification of academic
10	distress and that no public school within the school district is classified
11	as being in academic distress <u>;</u>
12	(2) The public school or school district
13	has made sufficient progress on the issues that caused the classification of
14	academic distress such that the public school or school district should be
15	returned to the local control of its residents; or
16	(3) That it is in the best interest of
17	the public school or school district to return the public school or school
18	district to the local control of its residents; or
19	(iii) Annex, consolidate, or reconstitute the school
20	district pursuant to this title.
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22	SECTION 6. Arkansas Code \S 6-15-430(e)(1), concerning academic
23	distress, is amended to read as follows:
24	(e)(1) $rac{If,\ by}{By}$ the end of the fifth school year following the public
25	school's or school district's classification of academic distress status, the
26	public school or school district in academic distress has not corrected all
27	issues that caused the classification of academic distress, the state board,
28	after a public hearing, shall consolidate, annex, or reconstitute the school
29	district under this section <u>if:</u>
30	(A) The public school or school district in academic
31	distress has not corrected all issues that caused the classification of
32	academic distress;
33	(B) The public school or school district has not made
34	sufficient progress on the issues that caused the classification of academic
35	distress such that the public school or school district should be returned to
36	the local control of its residents: or

1	(C) It is not in the best interest of the public school or
2	school district to return the public school or school district to the local
3	control of its residents.
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5	SECTION 7. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
6	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that a public school and school
7	district are best served when the residents of the school district exercise
8	local control over the school district; that the criteria for the return to
9	local control of a public school or school district that has been taken over
10	by the state because of a classification of being in academic distress are
11	rigid and without flexibility; that the State Board of Education should be
12	able to exercise discretion in returning a public school or school district
13	to local control; and that this act is immediately necessary to prevent
14	further harm to public schools or school districts that are under the control
15	of the state by allowing the State Board of Education to exercise discretion
16	in returning the public schools or school districts to local control of their
17	residents. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being
18	immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and
19	safety shall become effective on:
20	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
21	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
22	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
23	bill; or
24	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
25	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
