- SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 3-5-904 is amended to read as follows: 2 3-5-904. Eligibility.
  - (a) Only Except as provided in subsection (c) of this section, only those wineries actively involved in the sale of wine as an Arkansas-bonded winery for five (5) years or that have a federal license and are licensed by the State of Arkansas as of January 1, 2003, shall be eligible to receive grants under the provisions of this subchapter.
  - (b) Only Except as provided in subsection (c) of this section, only those wineries located in this state which use not less than seventy-five percent (75%) of Arkansas-grown and Arkansas-produced grapes, fruits, berries, or vegetables for producing wine shall be eligible to receive grants under the provisions of this subchapter.
  - (c) However, in In any year in which there are losses in production of Arkansas-grown grapes, fruits, berries, or vegetables used in the production of wine resulting from droughts, floods, tornadoes, extreme weather conditions, or other natural causes, the percentage of Arkansas-grown and Arkansas-produced grapes, fruits, berries, or vegetables used in producing wine, as required in this subchapter, shall be reduced in the proportion of the losses in production of the products as determined and set forth in a disaster relief order issued by the Director of the Department of Finance and Administration prepared under the same procedures as set forth in the Native Wine Industry Disaster Relief Act, §§ 3-5-405 [repealed] and § 3-5-801 et seq.

- SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 3-5-907(b), concerning the amount of grant fund payments for native wine incentives, is amended to read as follows:
- (b) Grant Except for funds received under § 3-5-1802, funds awarded shall be distributed equally to each winery at a base amount not to exceed twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000), with any remaining balance of the grant to be divided among each grantee according to the same ratio as the wine taxes paid in the previous calendar year by the grantee, as determined by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State.

- SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 3-5-1605(a)(4)(A), concerning license fees for small farm wineries, is amended to read as follows:
  - (4)(A) For the privilege of selling small farm wine wine, small

2	manufacturer's winery, there shall be paid for each wholesale dealer's
3	license a fee of one hundred dollars (\$100).
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5	SECTION 5. Arkansas Code Title 3, Chapter 5, is amended to add an
6	additional subchapter to read as follows:
7	Subchapter 18 - Wine Sales in Grocery Stores
8	
9	3-5-1801. Definitions.
10	As used in this subchapter:
11	(1) "Grocery store" means a single physical establishment that:
12	(A) Has an inventory of human-consumable items; and
13	(B) Is located in a wet territory;
14	(2) "Slotting fee" means a fee paid by a manufacturer to a
15	grocery store for making room for a product on the grocery store's shelves;
16	<u>and</u>
17	(3) "Wine" means port, wine, sherry wine, vermouth wine, or
18	other wines manufactured within or without the State of Arkansas, the
19	alcoholic content of which does not exceed twenty-one percent (21%).
20	
21	3-5-1802. Grocery store wine permit — Fees.
22	(a) A grocery store may apply to the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board
23	for a grocery store wine permit.
24	(b)(1) A grocery store wine permit shall allow a permittee to purchase
25	and sell wine for off-premises consumption at a single location.
26	(2) Wine inventory orders or purchases, or both, shall be made
27	only by a permittee for delivery to a single permitted location.
28	(3) An order of wine inventory for one (1) location shall not be
29	combined with an order for another location in a manner that would result in
30	a cumulative discount or quantity discount, or both.
31	(c) A grocery store seeking a grocery store wine permit shall meet the
32	criteria for the holder of an off-premises retail beer permit in addition to
33	the criteria established in this section.
34	(d)(1) For the privilege of selling wine in a grocery store, each
35	grocery store shall pay a grocery store wine permit fee based on the size of
36	the permitted building space.

1	(2) The fee shall be:
2	(A) One thousand dollars (\$1,000) for a permitted building
3	space containing less than thirty-five thousand one square feet (35,001 sq.
4	<u>ft.);</u>
5	(B) Two thousand five hundred dollars ( $\$2,500$ ) for a
6	permitted building space containing between thirty-five thousand one square
7	feet (35,001 sq. ft.) and fifty thousand square feet (50,000 sq. ft.);
8	(C) Three thousand five hundred dollars ( $$3,500$ ) for a
9	permitted building space containing between fifty thousand one square feet
10	(50,001 sq. ft.) and seventy-five thousand square feet (75,000 sq. ft.); and
11	(D) Five thousand dollars (\$5,000) for a permitted
12	building space containing more than seventy-five thousand square feet (75,000
13	<u>sq. ft.).</u>
14	(e) One hundred percent (100%) of the fee shall be paid into the
15	Arkansas Wine Grants Fund.
16	(f) A grocery store wine permittee may conduct tasting events for
17	educational and promotional purposes on the permittee's premises after
18	obtaining a wine sampling permit from the Alcoholic Beverage Control Division
19	under § 3-5-104.
20	(g)(l) A grocery store seeking a grocery store wine permit may derive
21	no more than twenty percent (20%) of its gross sales from the sale of
22	alcoholic beverages.
23	(2) However, the requirement under subdivision (g)(l) of this
24	section does not apply to an otherwise qualifying grocery store that, as of
25	January 1, 2017, derives more than twenty percent (20%) of its gross sales
26	from the sale of alcoholic beverages.
27	(h) A grocery store wine permittee shall offer for sale small farm
28	winery wine as defined in § 3-5-1601 et seq.
29	(i) A grocery store wine permit shall be available for issue only in a
30	county in which the retail sale of alcohol under § 3-4-604 was authorized as
31	of January 1, 2017.
32	
33	3-5-1803. Slotting fees prohibited.
34	A grocery store shall not require payment of a slotting fee for
35	products sold under this subchapter by a small farm winery, including without
36	limitation:

1	(1) Juice;
2	(2) Low alcohol wine; and
3	(3) Vinegar.
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5	SECTION 6. Arkansas Code § 19-6-301, concerning special revenue
6	enumerated, is amended to read as follows:
7	(255) Arkansas Wine Special Revenue Fund, § 19-5-1258.
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9	SECTION 7. Arkansas Code Title 3, Chapter 5, Subchapter 9, is amended
10	to add an additional section to read as follows:
11	19-5-1258. Arkansas Wine Special Revenue Fund.
12	(a) There is established on the books of the Treasurer of State,
13	Auditor of State, and Chief Fiscal Officer of the State the "Arkansas Wine
14	Grants Fund", into which shall be paid moneys received from permit fees paid
15	<u>under § 3-5-1802.</u>
16	(b) Fifty percent (50%) of the grant funds received under § 3-5-1802
17	shall be divided among each grantee according to the same ratio as the wine
18	taxes paid in the previous calendar year by the grantee as determined by the
19	Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, not to exceed the amount paid in by each
20	grantee.
21	(c) Fifty percent (50%) of the grant funds received under § 3-5-1802
22	shall be deposited into the Tourism Development Trust Fund of the Department
23	of Parks and Tourism § 19-5-956 for the purpose of operating and staffing a
24	wine tourism facility and office space for the Arkansas Wine Producers
25	Council within the tourism facility in Franklin County, Arkansas.
26	(d)(1) Any unused or undesignated grant funds at the end of the fiscal
27	year shall be directed to the Department of Parks and Tourism.
28	(2)(A) The Department of Parks and Tourism in consultation with
29	the Arkansas Wine Producers' Council, shall use funds provided for in
30	subdivision (d)(1) of this section to support wine tourism, marketing
31	efforts, research to support Arkansas wineries, or the wine tourism facility.
32	(B) Expenditures under subdivision (d)(2)(A) of this
33	section may include without limitation:
34	(i) Biking trails;
35	(ii) Brochures;
36	(iii) Hiking trails;

1	(iv) Museums;
2	(v) Signage;
3	(vi) Wine education seminars; and
4	(vii) Other similar purposes.
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6	SECTION 8. Uncodified Section 4 of Act 668 of 2007 is repealed.
7	SECTION 4. NOT TO BE CODIFIED. In the event that this act, or any
8	part thereof, is determined by a court to be unconstitutional, this act shall
9	become void and all wines, including native wines, distributed for sale in
10	the State of Arkansas shall be distributed under § 3-2-401 et seq. and sold
11	by licensed retailers under § 3-4-201 et seq.
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13	SECTION 9. DO NOT CODIFY. Grocery store wine permit issuance delay.
14	In a county in which the retail sale of alcoholic beverages under § 3-
15	4-604 was authorized between January 1, 2014, and January 1, 2017 and in
16	which at least one (1) permit to sell and dispense vinous or spirituous
17	liquors for beverage purposes at retail is currently active, a grocery store
18	wine permit under this act shall not be issued until January 1, 2019.
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20	SECTION 10. DO NOT CODIFY. Legislative intent.
21	The Department of Arkansas Heritage, Department of Parks and Tourism,
22	and the Arkansas Wine Producers Council shall, on a top priority basis,
23	actively seek funds for the purpose of construction of the Arkansas Wine
24	Center.
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
