31	<u>(b) The task</u>	force shall consist of twenty-nine (29)	<u>nembers as</u>
32	follows:		
33	<u>(1) Th</u>	e Chair of the Senate Committee on Educati	ion;

20	(13) The Executive Director of the Arkansas Community Colleges;
21	(14) Two (2) career and technical education teachers appointed

25	(16) Six (6) members recommended by the Arkansas State Chamber

3	(c)(1)(A) The Chair of the Senate Committee on Education shall call	
4	the first meeting of the task force within sixty (60) days of the effective	
5	date of this act and shall serve as the chair of the task force.	
6	(B) The Chair of the House Committee on Education shall	
7	serve as the vice-chair of the task force.	
8	(2) At the first meeting of task force, the members of the task	
9	force shall elect from its membership other officers as needed for the	
10	transaction of business.	
11	(3)(A) The task force shall conduct its meetings at the State	
12	Capitol Building or another site selected by the chair.	
13	(B) Meetings of the task force shall be held at least one	
14	(1) time every three (3) months but may occur more often at the call of the	
15	<u>chair.</u>	
16	(4) The task force shall establish rules and procedures for	
17	conducting business.	
18	(5) If a vacancy occurs on the task force, the vacancy shall be	
19	filled in the same manner as the original appointment.	
20	(6)(A) Legislative members of the task force shall be paid per	
21	diem and mileage as authorized by law for attendance at meetings of interim	
22	committees of the General Assembly.	
23	(B) Non-legislative members of the task force shall serve	
24	without compensation but may receive reimbursement under § 25-16-902.	
25	(7)(A) A majority of the members of the task force shall	
26	constitute a quorum for transacting business.	
27	<u>(B) No action may be taken by the task force except by a</u>	
28	majority vote at a meeting at which a quorum is present.	
29	(8) The task force may expend funds and resources in carrying	
30	out its purpose and responsibilities that are appropriated or funded by the	
31	General Assembly or a third party.	
32	(9) The Bureau of Legislative Research shall provide staff for	
33	the task force.	
34	(d)(1) The task force shall review and research ways to improve career	
35	and technical education programs and workforce development programs and to	
36	align career and technical education programs and workforce development	

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1	programs to achieve a positive economic impact on the State of Arkansas.	
2	(2) The task force shall:	
3	(A) Review the current structure, fiscal performance,	
4	compliance, and outcomes of the career and technical education programs and	
5	workforce development programs offered through:	
6	(i) High schools;	
7	(ii) Secondary vocational area centers, as defined	
8	<u>in § 6-20-2303;</u>	
9	(iii) Two-year institutions of higher education;	
10	(iv) Four-year institutions of higher education;	
11	(v) The Department of Career Education;	
12	(vi) The Department of Workforce Services;	
13	(vii) Apprenticeship schools, offices, and programs,	
14	including at the Department of Labor, Department of Career Education,	
15	Department of Workforce Services, Department of Human Services, and other	
16	apprenticeship schools receiving public funds; and	
17	(viii) Other agencies or organizations that offer	
18	career and technical education programs or workforce development programs;	
19	(B) Review the workforce needs of the state now and in the	
20	<u>future;</u>	
21	(C) Recommend strategies to meet the workforce needs of	
22	the state;	
23	(D) Research and recommend ways to improve the delivery of	
24	career and technical education programs and workforce development programs;	
25	(E) Research and recommend strategies to align the career	
26	and technical education programs and workforce development programs;	
27	(F) Research and recommend strategies that:	
28	(i) Reduce skill shortages;	
29	(ii) Enhance the state's economic growth;	
30	(iii) Meet industry demands;	
31	(iv) Improve fiscal and operational consistency and	
32	efficiency as it relates to career and technical education among statewide	
33	high schools, secondary vocational area centers, apprenticeship programs, and	
34	two-year state-supported institutions of higher education;	
35	(v) Create alignment among educational and career	
36	pathways, concurrent credit opportunities, apprenticeship credits for	

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1	relevant secondary and college courses, and work-based learning opportunities
2	for students transitioning among high schools, secondary vocational area
3	centers, apprenticeship programs, two-year state-supported institutions of
4	higher education, and employment;
5	(vi) Identify and overcome barriers to improve
6	career and technical education programs and workforce development programs
7	and to align career and technical education programs and workforce
8	development programs to achieve a positive economic impact on the State of
9	Arkansas, including without limitation:
10	(a) Any limitations on work-based learning
11	opportunities for high school and college students;
12	(b) A lack of career-centric, outcome-based
13	incentives at all levels of education;
14	(c) The gap between education requirements and
15	employer and labor market needs; and
16	(d) The lack of strategic alignment and
17	collaboration among the similarly motivated workforce and education programs
18	of agencies, school districts, and institutions of higher education; and
19	(vii) Provide access to high-quality, globally
20	competitive career and technical education programs and workforce development
21	programs;
22	(G) Review best practices among other states;
23	(H) Review regional, prioritized occupations and skills
24	needed by using the priorities and regions defined by each local workforce
25	development board under the Arkansas Workforce Innovation and Opportunity
26	Act, § 15-4-3701 et seq., as a starting point, which shall drive program and
27	funding priorities for the entities, pathways, curricula, training, and
28	credit opportunities;
29	(I) Review methods to create and implement a statewide
30	plan for promotion and recruitment of talent to opportunities in the highest
31	priority occupations;
32	(J) Review ways to reduce duplication of effort and
33	achieve alignment and collaboration in improving career and technical
34	education programs and workforce development programs and aligning career and
35	technical education programs and workforce development programs to achieve a
36	positive economic impact on the State of Arkansas;

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1	(K) Engage the following:
2	(i) Local workforce development committees under the
3	Arkansas Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act, § 15-4-3701 et seq.;
4	(ii) Arkansas Economic Development Commission;
5	(iii) Department of Workforce Services;
6	(iv) Department of Higher Education;
7	(v) Department of Education;
8	(vi) Department of Career Education;
9	(vii) Administrators of two-year state-supported
10	institutions of higher education;
11	(viii) Arkansas Community Colleges;
12	(ix) Association of Arkansas Development
13	Organizations;
14	(x) Arkansas Association of Education
15	Administrators;
16	(xi) Secondary vocational area center directors; and
17	(xii) Public school district superintendents; and
18	(L) Review methods to create and adopt an inter-agency
19	data and information sharing plan that includes accounting for necessary
20	information technology infrastructure that records and makes available to all
21	agencies the funding provided and obligated, whether federal or state funds,
22	to support education, training, workforce development, and related equipment
23	and infrastructure.
24	(e)(1) On or before February 1, 2018, the task force shall file with
25	the Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the President Pro
26	Tempore of the Senate, and the chairs of the House Committee on Education and
27	the Senate Committee on Education a written preliminary report of the
28	activities, findings, and recommendations of the task force.
29	(2)(A) On or before September 1, 2018, the task force shall file
30	with the Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the President
31	Pro Tempore of the Senate, and the chairs of the House Committee on Education
32	and the Senate Committee on Education a written, final report of the
33	activities, findings, and recommendations of the task force.
34	(B) The task force may file an updated final report on or
35	before July 1, 2019.
36	(f) The task force expires on July 1, 2019.
