24	5-71-218. Unlawful mass picketing.	
25	(a) As used in this section, "mass picketing" means the assembly or	<u>-</u>
26	persons in the use of pickets or demonstrations at or near a business,	
27	school, or private facility.	
28	(b) A person commits the offense of unlawful mass picketing if the	
29	person knowingly:	
30	(1) Engages in mass picketing that:	
31	(A) Obstructs access by the mass picketing to the pursu	<u>iit</u>
32	of lawful work or employment; or	
33	(B) Obstructs:	
34	(i) The entrance to or egress from a place of	
35	<pre>employment; or</pre>	
36	(ii) Free use of public roads, streets, highways,	_

1	railways, airports, or other rights-of-way of travel or conveyance; or
2	(2) Engages in mass picketing at a private residence that:
3	(A) Obstructs the entrance to or exit from the private
4	residence; or
5	(B) Includes a threat of violence or intimidation
6	communicated near or contiguous to the private residence.
7	(c) This section does not apply to a person who is validly exercising
8	his or her rights as guaranteed by the United States Constitution or the
9	Arkansas Constitution.
10	(d) Unlawful mass picketing is a Class A misdemeanor.
11	(e)(1) A person or entity who is harmed by unlawful mass picketing
12	under this section may seek injunctive relief in the circuit court having
13	jurisdiction to enjoin a person engaged in unlawful mass picketing from
14	participating in unlawful mass picketing.
15	(2) A court hearing a petition for injunctive relief under this
16	subsection may award court costs and reasonable attorney's fees to a
17	prevailing party as well as order a civil fine of up to one thousand dollars
18	(\$1,000) per day for a person who violates an order enjoining him or her from
19	engaging in unlawful mass picketing.
