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                       (B)(i) A teacher certified by the national board who moves
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     into the state on or before January 1, 2017 and is employed full time as a
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     classroom teacher, building-level principal, or building-level assistant
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     principal in an Arkansas public school district shall be eligible for the
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     yearly incentive bonus of five thousand dollars ($5,000) for every school
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     year the person is employed full time as a classroom teacher, building-level
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     principal, or building-level assistant principal in a local public school
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     district for the life of the certificate of the national board no more than
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     ten (10) school years.
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                             (ii) A teacher who holds national board
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     certification on or after August 1, 2009, who moves into the state on or
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     before January 1, 2017, shall be eligible for the yearly incentive bonus of
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     five thousand dollars ($5,000) for every school year the teacher is employed
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     full time for the life of the certificate of the national board no more than
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     ten (10) school years if, after working for three (3) years with national
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     board certification as a classroom teacher, building-level principal, or
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     building-level assistant principal in a public school district in this state,
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     the teacher is employed as a teacher in an accredited teacher preparation

7	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 6-17-413(d), concerning bonus funding for	
8	speech-language pathologists, is amended to read as follows:	
9	(d)(l) As used in this subsection, "speech-language pathologist" means	
10	a speech-language pathologist who:	
11	(A) Has a master's degree, which includes medical-based	
12	training;	
13	(B) Has completed a one-year clinical fellowship;	
14	(C) Has passed the specialty area of the National Teachers	
15	Examination; and	
16	(D) Holds a Gertificate of Clinical Competence in Speech-	
17	Language Pathology from the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association.	
18	(2) By December 1 of each year, the department shall pay a	
19	yearly incentive bonus of five thousand dollars (\$5,000) to a speech-language	
20	pathologist who:	
21	(A) Holds an Arkansas teaching license in speech-language	
22	pathology;	
23	(B) Is a full-time employee of an Arkansas education	
24	service cooperative or public school district as a speech-language	
25	pathologist at the time of receiving the bonus; and	
26	(C) Is not considered a purchased service contractor but	
27	may be employed under a teacher contract subject to renewal under § 6-17-	
28	1506.	
29	(3)(A)(i) Bonuses paid to a certified speech-language	
30	pathologist under this subsection shall be paid from the funds appropriated	
31	and available for bonuses to speech-language pathologists.	
32	(ii) If sufficient funds are not available to pay	
33	the full amount of the bonus to each certified speech-language pathologist as	
34	provided under this section, the department may reduce the amount of the	
35	bonus for each qualified recipient proportionately as necessary to provide a	
36	bonus to each qualified speech-language pathologist in an equal amount.	

1	(B) The cost and expenses related to training for or
2	acquisition of the certificate shall not be funded through the program
3	created under this section and § 6-17-412 but shall be the responsibility of
4	the certified speech-language pathologist.
5	(4) Although a certified speech-language pathologist entitled to
6	a bonus under this subsection will hold a valid Arkansas teaching license in
7	speech-language pathology, references to "teacher" under this section shall
8	mean a classroom teacher as defined under § 6-17-412(a)(1) who is in the
9	program but not a certified speech-language pathologist.
10	(5)(A)(i) If a speech-language pathologist who receives a bonus
11	under this subsection leaves employment in the Arkansas public school system
12	before completing three (3) continuous school years of employment, the
13	speech-language pathologist shall repay the department a prorated portion of
14	the bonus received in the school year based on a daily rate for the remainder
15	of a school year in which the speech-language pathologist leaves employment.
16	(ii) The first year of the three (3) continuous
17	school years is the first year that the speech-language pathologist received
18	a bonus under this subsection (d).
19	(iii) The daily rate is calculated as the amount of
20	the annual bonus paid to the speech-language pathologist divided by the
21	number of days in the speech-language pathologist's contract.
22	(B) The State Board of Education may suspend the Arkansas
23	speech-language pathology license of any person who fails to repay the amount
24	of the bonus required to be repaid under this subdivision (d)(5).
25	(C) Repayment of all or a portion of a bonus under this
26	subdivision (d)(5) is not required if, due to the death or disability of the
27	speech-language pathologist or other extenuating circumstances as may be
28	recognized by the State Board of Education, the speech-language pathologist
29	does not remain employed in the Arkansas public school system for three (3)
30	continuous school years after first receiving the bonus under this
31	subsection. The department shall pay a yearly incentive bonus to a person
32	who:
33	(A) Holds national board certification; and
34	(B) Is, at the time of receiving the bonus, employed full-
35	time in a high-poverty school or high-poverty charter school as a:
36	(i) Classroom teacher;

1	(ii) Instructional facilitator; or
2	(iii) Instructional leader.
3	(2) A yearly incentive bonus under this subsection shall be:
4	(A) Five thousand dollars (\$5,000) for a person who is, at
5	the time of receiving the bonus, employed full-time in a high-poverty school
6	that is not in a high-poverty district; or
7	(B) Ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) for a person who is, at
8	the time of receiving the bonus, employed full time in a:
9	(i) High-poverty school in a high-poverty district;
10	<u>or</u>
11	(ii) High-poverty charter school.
12	(3) A yearly incentive bonus under this subsection shall be
13	<u>limited as follows:</u>
14	(A) A person shall not receive a five thousand dollar
15	(\$5,000) bonus under subdivision (d)(2)(A) of this section in more than five
16	(5) school years;
17	(B) A person shall not receive a ten thousand dollar
18	(\$10,000) bonus under subdivision (d)(2)(B) of this section in more than ten
19	(10) school years;
20	(C) A person shall not receive any yearly incentive bonus
21	under this subsection in more than ten (10) school years;
22	(D) A person shall not receive in the same school year
23	both a five thousand dollar (\$5,000) bonus under subdivision (d)(2)(A) of
24	this section and a ten thousand dollar (\$10,000) bonus under subdivision
25	(d)(2)(B) of this section; and
26	(E)(i) A person shall not receive in the same school year
27	both a bonus under this subsection and a bonus under subsection (a) of this
28	section.
29	(ii) A person who, as of December 1, 2017, meets the
30	qualifications for a yearly incentive bonus under both this subsection and
31	subsection (a) of this section may make an irrevocable election to receive
32	future yearly incentive bonuses under this subsection by filing a written
33	election with the department no later than July 1, 2019.
34	(e) As used in this section:
35	(1) "High-poverty charter school" means an Arkansas open-
36	enrollment public charter school in which seventy percent (70%) or greater of

T	the previous school year's enrolled students are national school lunch
2	students as defined in § 6-20-2303;
3	(2) "High-poverty district" means an Arkansas public school
4	district in which seventy percent (70%) or greater of the previous school
5	year's enrolled students are national school lunch students as defined in §
6	<u>6-20-2303;</u>
7	(3) "High-poverty school" means an Arkansas public school in
8	which seventy percent (70%) or greater of the previous school year's enrolled
9	students are national school lunch students as defined in § 6-20-2303; and
10	(4)(A) "Instructional leader" means a building-level
11	administrator who is responsible for evaluating teachers or instructional
12	staff.
13	(B) "Instructional leader" includes without limitation a
14	building-level administrator who is an evaluator as defined in § 6-17-2803.
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
