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23	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:								
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25	SECTION 1. The introductory language of Arkansas Code § 6-17-								
26	413(a)(3)(A) and § 6-17-413(a)(3)(A)(i)-(iii), concerning National Board for								
27	Professional Teaching Standards certification funding, is amended to read as								
28	follows:								
29	(3)(A) The department shall pay a starting incentive bonus of

Arkansas Code § 6-17-413(a)(3)(B) and (C), concerning National Board for Professional Teaching Standards certification funding, is amended to read as follows: (B)(i) A teacher certified by the national board who moves into the state on or before January 1, 2017 and is employed full time as a classroom teacher, building-level principal, or building-level assistant principal in an Arkansas public school district shall be eligible for the yearly incentive bonus of five thousand dollars (\$5,000) for every school year the person is employed full time as a classroom teacher, building-level principal, or building-level assistant principal in a local public school district for the life of the certificate of the national board no more than

21 (ii) A teacher who holds national board 22 certification on or after August 1, 2009, who moves into the state on or 23 before January 1, 2017, shall be eligible for the yearly incentive bonus of 24 five thousand dollars (\$5,000) for every school year the teacher is employed 25 full time for the life of the certificate of the national board no more than 26 ten (10) school years if, after working for three (3) years with national 27 board certification as a classroom teacher, building-level principal, or 28 building-level assistant principal in a public school district in this state, 29 the teacher is employed as a teacher in an accredited teacher preparation program at a state-supported institution of higher education if funds are 30 31 available after payments are made to those eligible under subdivisions (a)(3)(A)(iv)(a) and (a)(3)(B)(i) of this section. 32
