- 36 INTRASTATE METRO PLANNING GRANTS. As referenced in Section 9 of Act 637 of

- 1 1995, the authorized funding for Intrastate Metro Planning Grants that are
- 2 evenly distributed among planning and development districts under the
- 3 Miscellaneous Grants and Expenses Section of this Act shall include the West
- 4 Central Arkansas Economic Development District.
