21 PROCEDURES - MEDICAL MARIJUANA IMPLEMENTATION AND REGULATION. In the event
22 that sufficient appropriation is not provided by the General Assembly for
23 expenditures resulting from the implementation and regulation of the Arkansas
24 Medical Marijuana Amendment of 2016 for any state agency, pursuant to
25 Arkansas Code § 19-4-701 et seq., said agency shall request a transfer of
26 appropriation from the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, stating clearly the
27 amount required. Upon approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State said
28 appropriations shall be established upon the books of the Department of
29 Finance and Administration in compliance with the applicable classifications
30 of appropriations as enumerated in Arkansas Code §§ 19-4-521 through 19-4-
31 527.

32 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2017~~
33 2018 through June 30, ~~2018~~ 2019.

35 SECTION 74. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
36 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND

1 TRANSFER AUTHORITY. From time to time, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State
2 may transfer from his or her books and those of the Treasurer of State and
3 the Auditor of State from the Medical Marijuana Implementation and Operations
4 Fund to various state agencies' funds the amounts necessary to fund the
5 expenses for the implementation, administration, and/or enforcement of the
6 Arkansas Medical Marijuana Amendment of 2016.

7 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2017~~
8 2018 through June 30, ~~2018~~ 2019.

9
10 SECTION 75. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
11 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
12 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
13 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
14 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
15 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
16 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
17 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
18 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

19
20 SECTION 76. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
21 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
22 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for
23 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
24 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
25 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
26 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
27 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

28
29 SECTION 77. EFFECTIVE DATE. This act is effective on and after July 1,
30 2018.

31
32 SECTION 78. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. (a) It is found and determined by the
33 General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that section 36 of this act
34 regarding the Wine Grants Program authorizing the DFA - Disbursing Officer to
35 distribute grants to Arkansas wineries pursuant to Arkansas Code § 19-6-
36 839(b) requires immediate implementation to ensure the operations of the

1 agency are not interrupted or impaired. Therefore, an emergency is declared
2 to exist, and section 36 of this act being immediately necessary for the
3 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective
4 on:

5 (1) The date of its approval by the Governor;

6 (2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
7 the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
8 bill; or

9 (3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
10 overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
