19	WHEREAS, Dr. Robert J. Smith, born in Hayti, Missouri, to T.J. and
20	Annie Smith, died on February 12, 2018, at the age of eighty-eight (88)
21	years; and
22	
23	WHEREAS, Dr. Smith graduated from his high school as valedictorian and
24	matriculated at and graduated from Southern Illinois University; and
25	
26	WHEREAS, in 1951 he was accepted into the University of Missouri
27	Medical School, a time when there were no other African-American graduates of
28	the school's medical program; and
29	
30	WHEREAS, Dr. Smith earned his diploma, making him the first African-
31	American graduate of the then two-year curriculum; and
32	
33	WHEREAS, Dr. Smith then transferred to Meharry Medical College in
34	Nashville, Tennessee, where he finished his medical degree in 1955; and
35	
36	WHEREAS, while in Nashville he was so inspired by the African-American



1 doctors and students whom he met there, as well as by the work of Dr. Martin 2 Luther King Jr., that he made the bold choice to stay in the South during the 3 civil rights movement; and 4 5 WHEREAS, in 1966 he moved to the small town of Pine Bluff, Arkansas, 6 where he began a practice, married, and started a family; and 7 8 WHEREAS, while in Pine Bluff, he became a leading activist throughout 9 the city and within the state, speaking on behalf of disenfranchised African-10 American Arkansans who were underrepresented politically, socially, and 11 civically; and 12 13 WHEREAS, Dr. Smith relocated to Murfreesboro, Tennessee, where he 14 served as chief of surgery at the Veterans Administration hospital for 15 several years; and 16 17 WHEREAS, in 1989 he and his wife, the late Dorothy J. Smith, moved to 18 Memphis, Tennessee, where he became a prominent member of the community, 19 involved himself in the campaigns of several politicians, held numerous 20 professional memberships, wrote more than twenty (20) published articles, and 21 was a devoted member of Whitehaven Middle Baptist Church for over thirty (30) 22 years; and 23 24 WHEREAS, Dr. Smith will be remembered by his colleagues, patients, and 25 friends for his scholarship, competence, and compassion, 26 27 NOW THEREFORE, 28 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FIRST GENERAL 29 ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS: 30 31 THAT the House of Representatives remember and commend Dr. Robert J. 32 Smith for his contributions to society. 33 34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the individual members of the House of 35 Representatives hereby express sincere condolences to the family of Dr. 36 Smith, and upon adoption of this resolution, that an appropriate copy be
