25 SECTION 20. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 26 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EMERGENCY 27 GRANTS & EXTRA HELP POOL. An Institution of higher education that suffers an 28 emergency/disaster event resulting in all or a significant portion of campus 29 operations being interrupted, may request disaster assistance through the 30 Arkansas Department of Higher Education. Upon the declaration of an 31 emergency by the Governor, the institution may request, subject to the 32 recommendation of the Director of the Department of Higher Education and 33 approval of the Governor, a grant from the Disaster Relief Fund to assist in 34 returning that campus to operation and/or to a sister campus providing 35 services to the students from the affected campus. Certified law enforcement 36 officers employed by an institution of higher education may be granted

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jurisdiction at the sister institution, upon agreement of both institutions. The Department of Higher Education is authorized a pool of 500 extra help positions for use in such emergency situations. These positions may be assigned to the campus suffering the disaster event or to a sister campus providing services to the students from the affected campus. The Governor may waive the 1,500 hour limit of ACA 6-63-314 on these assigned extra help pool positions.

8 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2017
9 2018 through June 30, 2018 2019.

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11 SECTION 21. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 12 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. REALLOCATION OF RESOURCES FOR INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION. Upon 13 14 determination by the president or chancellor of an institution of higher 15 education that a reallocation of resources for purposes of reorganization or 16 consolidation of administrative functions within the institution is necessary 17 for efficient and effective operations of the institution, the president or 18 chancellor, with approval of the institution's board of trustees, may have 19 the authority to transfer positions, appropriations and related funds between 20 campuses, divisions, branches, and other budgetary units of the institution, 21 after receiving prior approval of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget 22 Committee. The transfers of positions, programs, or activities shall be used 23 for those purposes for which the appropriations were approved by the General 24 Assembly. The transfers, consolidations, or reorganizations which involve 25 academic programs shall be reviewed by the Department of Higher Education 26 prior to submission to the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee. 27 Provided, however, that the institution shall be limited to submitting no 28 more than two (2) individual transaction transfer requests during any fiscal 29 year and shall be further limited to no more than five percent (5%) of the 30 total General Revenue and Special Revenue appropriation, funding, positions 31 specific to each institution, and no Tobacco Settlement funds or 32 appropriations may be reallocated pursuant to this section. 33 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of 34 appropriation and general revenue funding for institutions of higher 35 education each fiscal year is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This 36 is usually accomplished by delineating such maximums in the appropriation

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1 act(s) for institutions of higher education and the general revenue 2 allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by amendment to the Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly has determined that 3 4 institutions of higher education may operate more efficiently if some 5 flexibility is provided to institutions of higher education authorizing broad 6 powers under this Section. Therefore, it is both necessary and appropriate 7 that the General Assembly maintain oversight by requiring prior approval of 8 the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee as provided by this 9 section. The requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint 10 Budget Committee is not a severable part of this section. If the requirement 11 of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled 12 unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is 13 void.

17 SECTION 22. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 18 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. LOANS. In 19 order to provide timely payments under financial aid appropriations made in 20 this Act, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State is authorized to provide 21 loans from the Budget Stabilization Trust Fund to make available all funds 22 attributable to the financial aid programs under the then current official 23 revenue estimates. In the event of an unanticipated state revenue shortfall, 24 any such loans remaining at the end of a fiscal year shall be repaid from 25 revenues distributed in the first two months of the next fiscal year. Funds 26 for appropriations made in this Act for purposes other than financial aid 27 shall not be affected by the application of this provision.

28 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2017

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SECTION 23. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. WORK FORCE 2000 DEVELOPMENT FUND PROCEDURES. After the amounts to be made available to the various technical colleges have been determined as set out in Arkansas Code 26-51-205(d)(2)(A) and 26-51-205(d)(2)(B), such documents as may be necessary shall be processed so that funds may be transferred from the

1 Work Force 2000 Development Fund to the State Treasury fund or fund account 2 from which the technical college draws its general revenue support. Such 3 funds as may be transferred shall not exceed 93.691% of the total funds 4 available from the Work Force 2000 Development Fund during the fiscal year. 5 In the event that a technical institute or comprehensive lifelong learning 6 center which receives support from the Work Force 2000 Development Fund as 7 determined by law transfers or merges into the Arkansas Technical College and 8 Community College System for which Work Force 2000 Development Fund monies 9 are determined by law, then the actual amount of support from the Work Force 10 2000 Development Fund in the preceding fiscal year for such educational 11 institution shall be made available irrespective of any other provision of 12 law which sets out maximum levels of support from such fund.

SECTION 46. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and

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control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

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SECTION 47. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General 5 6 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations 7 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for 8 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive 9 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget 10 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or 11 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative 12 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. 13

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SECTION 49. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. (a) It is found and determined by the 17 18 General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that Section 44 - the Section 19 regarding Arkansas Workforce Challenge Scholarship Fund transfers, of this 20 act granting the Arkansas Department of Higher Education authority to make Arkansas Workforce Challenge Scholarship Fund transfers for scholarship 21 22 awards for nontraditional students; and Section 45 - the Section regarding 23 increasing the scholarship awards limit to nontraditional students, increasing the aggregate amount of scholarship awards to nontraditional 24 25 students to fifteen million dollars (\$15,000,000), requires immediate 26 implementation in order to facilitate a timely and efficient scholarship 27 transfer and funding process and to ensure these processes are not interrupted or impaired. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and 28 29 Section 44, regarding Arkansas Workforce Challenge Scholarship Fund 30 transfers, and Section 45, regarding the scholarship awards limit to nontraditional students, of this act being immediately necessary for the 31 32 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective 33 on: (1) The date of its approval by the Governor; 34 (2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, 35 36 the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
