4 SECTION 6. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 5 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. R.I.S.E. 6 ARKANSAS - CARRY FORWARD. Any unexpended balance of monies allocated for 7 R.I.S.E. Arkansas remaining on June 30, 2018 2019, in the Department of 8 Education Public School Fund Account shall be designated and retained for the 9 R.I.S.E. Arkansas. Any carry forward of unexpected balance of funding as 10 authorized herein, may be carried forward under the following conditions:

(1) Prior to June 30, 2018 2019 the Agency shall by written statement
 set forth its reason(s) for the need to carry forward said funding to the
 Department of Finance and Administration Office of Budget;

14 (2) The Department of Finance and Administration Office of Budget shall 15 report to the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee all 16 amounts carried forward by the September Arkansas Legislative Council or 17 Joint Budget Committee meeting which report shall include the name of the 18 Agency, Board, Commission or Institution and the amount of the funding 19 carried forward, the program name or line item, the funding source of that 20 appropriation and a copy of the written request set forth in item (1) above;

21 (3) Each Agency, Board, Commission or Institution shall provide a 22 written report to the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee 23 containing all information set forth in item (2) above, along with a written 24 statement as to the current status of the project, contract, purpose, etc. 25 for which the carry forward was originally requested no later than thirty 26 (30) days prior to the time the Agency, Board, Commission or Institution 27 presents its budget request to the Arkansas Legislative Council/Joint Budget 28 Committee; and

(4) Thereupon, the Department of Finance and Administration shall include all information obtained in item (3) above in the budget manuals and/or a statement of non-compliance by the Agency, Board, Commission or Institution.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2017
 <u>2018</u> through June 30, 2018 2019.

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SECTION 7. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

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1 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND 2 ALLOCATION. The appropriation for the Isolated Funding line item in the Grants and Aid to Local School Districts and Special Programs section of this 3 4 Act may be fully funded. Any funding and appropriation for Isolated Funding 5 that is not utilized shall be transferred to the appropriation for Special 6 Needs Isolated Funding in the Grants and Aid to Local School Districts and 7 Special Programs section of this Act and shall be used there for fully 8 funding each subsection (c) through (f) of Arkansas Code §6-20-604 on a pro 9 rata basis until the available funds are exhausted. Pro rata basis is defined 10 as providing each district qualifying for additional funding under 11 subsections (c) through (f) a proportionate share based on how each 12 district's additional funding amount bears to the total additional funding 13 amounts for all qualifying districts. If any funding and appropriation 14 remains after funding each subsection (c) through (f) of Arkansas Code §6-20-15 604 the remaining balance shall be used to fund the provisions of Arkansas 16 Code §6-20-604 (h) on an equal basis until the available funds are exhausted. 17 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2017 18 2018 through June 30, <del>2018</del> 2019.

20 SECTION 8. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 21 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. GRANTS TO 22 SCHOOL DISTRICTS. For the purposes of distributing the Grants To School 23 Districts appropriation in the Grants and Aid to Local School Districts and 24 Special Programs section of this Act, "school district" means a school 25 district which contracts with a school district in an adjoining state for the 26 education of some of the pupils within the Arkansas school district because 27 the portion of the school district wherein such pupils live is completely 28 separated from the remainder of the school district by a reservoir covering 29 at least 12,000 acres at normal water level, and where to attend school in 30 their own district, the pupils of said portion would be required to travel or 31 to be transported a distance (measured by the nearest highway or road route) 32 of more than 35 miles round trip and pass through another school district or 33 districts. The Department of Education shall distribute the monies 34 appropriated for Grants to School Districts in the Grants and Aid to Local 35 School Districts and Special Programs section of this Act to such school 36 districts as reimbursement for expenses incurred in educating the pupils

residing in the separated portion of the school district. The payments are to be limited to the amount of available appropriation. Such school districts shall file a request for reimbursement with the Department of Education and provide the Department of Education with such documentation as is deemed necessary.

6 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2017
7 <u>2018</u> through June 30, 2018 <u>2019</u>.

8

SECTION 9. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 9 10 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SPECIAL 11 EDUCATION SERVICES. The funds appropriated in the line item "Special 12 Education Services" in the Grants and Aid to Local School Districts and 13 Special Programs section of this Act shall be used to provide extended year 14 summer programs for handicapped students in need of such services, to provide 15 special education services to foster children who are wards of the State, and 16 to provide funds for the payment of salaries of special education 17 supervisors. The Department of Education shall distribute such funds in the 18 manner necessary to carry out the intent of this Section.

19 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2017
20 <u>2018</u> through June 30, 2018 <u>2019</u>.

21

22 SECTION 10. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 23 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 24 DESEGREGATION EXPENSES. (A) For the fiscal year ending June 30, and for each 25 fiscal year thereafter, the Department of Education shall from time to time 26 as needed, certify to the State Treasurer and the Chief Fiscal Officer of the 27 State, the amount of funds disbursed or approved to be disbursed by the 28 Department of Education for desegregation expenses under any "Desegregation 29 Settlement Agreement". Upon the receipt of such certification, the State 30 Treasurer, after making those deductions as set out in Arkansas Code 19-5-31 202(b)(2)(B), shall also deduct from the net general revenues the amount 32 certified and transfer this amount to the Department of Education Public 33 School Fund Account there to be used exclusively for payment of or 34 reimbursement for expenses incurred from the Department of Education Public 35 School Fund Account under any "Desegregation Settlement Agreement". 36 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2017

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SECTION 11. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
CONSOLIDATION INCENTIVE. The appropriation contained herein for Consolidation
Incentive shall be allocated in accordance with rules and regulations
established by the State Board of Education.

8 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2017
9 <u>2018</u> through June 30, 2018 <u>2019</u>.

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11 SECTION 12. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 12 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 13 RESIDENTIAL CENTERS/JUVENILE DETENTION. The funds appropriated herein for 14 Residential Centers/Juvenile Detention shall be allocated in accordance with 15 rules and regulations established by the State Board of Education.

16 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2017
17 <u>2018</u> through June 30, 2018 <u>2019</u>.

18

19 SECTION 13. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 20 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER 21 AUTHORITY. The Commissioner of the Department of Education, with the approval 22 of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and after approval by the Arkansas 23 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee, is hereby authorized to 24 request necessary appropriation transfers and any other budget related 25 adjustments necessary within the Department of Education. Provided, however, 26 that the Department of Education shall be limited to submitting no more than 27 two transfer requests during any fiscal year.

28 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of 29 appropriation and general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year 30 is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This is usually accomplished by 31 delineating such maximums in the appropriation act(s) for a state agency and 32 the general revenue allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by 33 amendment to the Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly 34 has determined that the Department of Education may operate more efficiently 35 if some flexibility is provided to the Commissioner of the Department of 36 Education authorizing broad powers under the Transfer Authority provision

herein. Therefore, it is both necessary and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight by requiring prior approval of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee as provided by this section. The requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is not a severable part of this section. If the requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled unconstitutional by a court jurisdiction, this entire section is void.

11 SECTION 14. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 12 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. AETN 13 DOCUMENTED QUIZ BOWL COSTS. Of the total amount of appropriation and funds 14 authorized herein to the Department of Education for the Quiz Bowl each 15 fiscal year, an amount not to exceed forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) each 16 fiscal year may be made available to the Department of Education -17 Educational Television Division for its documented costs associated with the 18 Quiz Bowl.

19 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2017
20 <u>2018</u> through June 30, 2019 <u>2019</u>.

21

22 SECTION 15. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 23 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 24 DISTRESSED SCHOOL DISTRICT SUPPORT. The funds appropriated in the line item 25 "Distressed School District Support" in the Grants and Aid to Local School 26 Districts and Special Programs section of this Act may be used for technical 27 assistance offered by the Department of Education to school districts in 28 academic distress that can include, but is not limited to, teacher 29 specialists, principal specialists, and other personnel assigned by the 30 department. These funds may also be used for alternative research-based 31 technical assistance or programs. Criteria for selecting and approving 32 alternative research-based technical assistance or programs are to be 33 promulgated as a rule by the State Board of Education, provided that 34 alternative staffing and/or compensation programs for teachers shall be 35 approved by at least a majority of the teachers in the school, schools, or 36 school district participating in the program.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, <del>2017</del>
 2018 through June 30, <del>2018</del> 2019.

4 SECTION 16. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 5 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 6 RETIREMENT MATCHING. Beginning with the 1996-97 school year, Local School 7 Districts shall pay the teacher retirement employer contribution rate for any 8 eligible employee in accordance with rules and regulations established by the 9 Teacher Retirement Board of Directors. The appropriation contained herein for 10 Teacher Retirement Matching each fiscal year shall be used to provide the 11 employer matching for employees of the Cooperative Education Services Areas, 12 Vocational Centers, Arkansas Easter Seals and the school operated by the 13 Department of Correction.

14 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, <del>2017</del> 15 <u>2018</u> through June 30, <del>2018</del> <u>2019</u>.

17 SECTION 17. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 18 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. BETTER 19 CHANCE PROGRAM ADMINISTRATIVE FEES. The Department of Education is hereby 20 authorized to expend a maximum of two percent (2%) of available funds for 21 administration of the Better Chance Program. Up to 1.8% of available funds 22 shall be used to administer the program and to monitor program grantees to 23 ensure compliance with programmatic standards. Prior to the utilization of 24 the remaining 0.2% of available funds, the Department of Education shall seek 25 prior review and approval of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget 26 Committee by providing a written request to include the following: a) the 27 Department's reason(s) for the use of the funds and b) the amount of funds 28 that will be expended. The Department may contract with the Division of Child 29 Care and Early Childhood Education to administer the program.

Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of appropriation and general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This is usually accomplished by delineating such maximums in the appropriation act(s) for a state agency and the general revenue allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by amendment to the Revenue Stabilization law. Therefore, it is both necessary and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight by requiring

prior approval of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee as provided by this section. The requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is not a severable part of this section. If the requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is void.
