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20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

23 SECTION 2. EXTRA HELP - OPERATIONS. There is hereby authorized, for
 24 the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences for the 2018-2019 fiscal
 25 year, the following maximum number of part-time or temporary employees, to be
 26 known as "Extra Help", payable from funds appropriated herein for such
 27 purposes: six hundred twenty-five (625) temporary or part-time employees,
 28 when needed, at rates of pay not to exceed those provided in the Uniform
 29 Classification and Compensation Act, or its successor, or this act for the
 30 appropriate classification.

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32 SECTION 3. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 33 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EXTRA
 34 HELP - UNIVERSITY HOSPITAL PRN POOL. There is hereby authorized, for the
 35 University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences, the following number of part-
 36 time or temporary positions, to be known as "PRN Extra Help", payable from

1 funds appropriated herein, for the purpose of employing RN's and LPN's in a
 2 Nursing PRN Pool: four hundred ten (410), when needed, at rates of pay not
 3 to exceed the rate of pay for comparable positions authorized by this Act.
 4 If the agency requests continuation of a "PRN Extra Help" position(s) as
 5 established herein during the next fiscal year, the extra help position(s)
 6 must be requested as a new extra help position(s) in the agency's budget
 7 request.

8 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2017~~
 9 2018 through June 30, ~~2018~~ 2019.

 11 SECTION 4. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 12 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EXTRA
 13 HELP - UAMS TEMPS. There is hereby authorized for the University of Arkansas
 14 for Medical Sciences, the following number of part-time or temporary
 15 positions, to be known as "UAMS TEMPS/EXTRA HELP", payable from funds
 16 appropriated herein, for the purpose of employing qualified individuals in a
 17 UAMS Temporary Pool: five hundred thirty (530), when needed, at rates of pay
 18 not to exceed the rate of pay for comparable positions authorized by this
 19 Act.

20 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2017~~
 21 2018 through June 30, ~~2018~~ 2019.

SECTION 37. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CHAPLAIN
HOUSING ALLOWANCE. The Chancellor of the University of Arkansas for Medical
Sciences may designate up to forty-five percent (45%) of the regular gross
salary (or stipend) of a minister or other clergy employed as a Chaplain or
appointed as a Chaplain Resident, as a housing allowance, to the extent used
by the person to rent or provide a home, according to the guidelines of the
Internal Revenue Service Code, Section 107 and the Arkansas Code 26-51-
404(b)(9).

SECTION 38. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

CARE REIMBURSEMENT. The University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences is

Indigent Care maintenance and general operations appropriations to be paid
from cash funds of the institution, subject to reimbursement and correction
of reporting, as provided by Arkansas Code 19-4-1609.

SECTION 39. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

1 ESTABLISHMENT OF A "GROWTH POOL". (a) The Arkansas Department of Higher
2 Education shall establish and maintain for the ~~2017-2018~~ 2018-2019 fiscal
3 year a pool of three hundred (300) nonclassified positions at a salary level
4 not to exceed \$302,356. These positions are to be used by the University of
5 Arkansas for Medical Sciences in the event that the personal services needs
6 of the University during the ~~2017-2018~~ 2018-2019 fiscal year exceed the
7 number of positions allocated to the University by the Legislature. The
8 University shall provide justification to the Arkansas Department of Higher
9 Education for the need to allocate titles from this "growth pool". No
10 classifications will be assigned to the pool until such time as specific
11 positions are requested by the University, approved by the University Board
12 or their designee, and approved by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget
13 Committee. Furthermore, the Office of Personnel Management (OPM) of the
14 Division of Management Services of the Department of Finance and
15 Administration shall establish and maintain for the ~~2017-2018~~ 2018-2019
16 fiscal year a pool of three hundred (300) career service positions up to a
17 C130. These positions are to be used by the University of Arkansas for
18 Medical Sciences in the event that the personal services needs of the
19 University during the ~~2017-2018~~ 2018-2019 fiscal year exceed the number of
20 positions in a classification allocated to the University by the Legislature.
21 The University shall provide justification to OPM for the need to allocate
22 titles from this "growth pool". No classifications will be assigned to the
23 pool until such time as specific positions are requested by the University,
24 recommended by OPM, and approved by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget
25 Committee.

26 (b) Determining the number of personnel to be employed by a state agency
27 is the prerogative of the General Assembly and is usually accomplished by
28 delineating the maximum number of personnel by identifying the job titles and
29 the maximum grade or salary attached to those salaries. The General Assembly
30 has determined that the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences could be
31 operated more efficiently if some flexibility is given to that institution.
32 That flexibility is being accomplished by providing growth pools in
33 subsection (a) of this section and since the General Assembly has granted the
34 institution broad powers under the growth pool concept, it is both necessary
35 and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight of the
36 utilization of the growth pool by requiring prior approval of the Legislative

1 Council or Joint Budget Committee in the utilization of the growth pool.

15 FAMILY LIFE INSTITUTE. The Child Health and Family Life Institute shall be
16 administered under the direction of Arkansas Children's Hospital. Arkansas
17 Children's Hospital shall enter into a cooperative agreement and/or contract
18 with the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences-Department of Pediatrics
19 for services required to deliver the programs of the Child Health and Family
20 Life Institute (CHFLI). Utilizing a multidisciplinary collaboration of
21 professionals, CHFLI shall provide a statewide effort to explore, develop and
22 evaluate new and better ways to address medically, socially and economically

30 offered through CHFLI.

36 FEES. On July 1 of each year the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences

1 shall pay from the appropriation provided herein from non-general revenue,
2 the total amount appropriated for War Memorial Stadium Commission Parking
3 Services from Fees to the War Memorial Stadium Commission.

4 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2017~~

7 SECTION 42. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
8 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER
9 PROVISIONS. Because the Rural Medical Practice Student Loan and Scholarship
10 Program Loans and/or Scholarships and the Community Match Student Loan and
11 Scholarship Program Loans and/or Scholarships have the goal of providing
12 primary care physicians in rural Arkansas, transfers may be made in such
13 amounts as are required between the line items made in the appropriation for
14 "Medical Loans and Scholarships".

18 SECTION 43. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
19 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CLINICAL
20 EXPANSION AND RESEARCH POOL. (a) In order to address personnel needs emerging
21 from expanding medical research and patient care issues and the necessity of
22 recruiting and retaining qualified medical, research, and related support
23 personnel, the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences or its successor
24 is authorized for the ~~2017-2018~~ 2018-2019 fiscal year a pool of seven hundred
25 (700) "Clinical Expansion and Research Pool" positions. These positions are
26 to be used by the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences in the event
27 that the personal services needs resulting from unanticipated clinical or
28 research programs that are initiated during the ~~2017-2018~~ 2018-2019 fiscal
29 year require additional positions, either in title, in classification, or in
30 number, that are not authorized or contemplated by the General Assembly in
31 the Regular Salaries - Operations section of this Act.

32 (b) The University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences is authorized to
33 access the "Clinical Expansion and Research Pool" positions authorized in
34 this Section at any time during the fiscal year when it is determined by the

36 COMPENSATION. On-call duty or standby duty differential may be authorized

1 for a Classified or Non-Classified patient care employee whose job requires

4 period, at rates of pay not to exceed those provided in the Uniform

12 PSYCHIATRIC RESEARCH INSTITUTE & DEPARTMENT OF PEDIATRICS REPORTS. The
13 University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences shall report quarterly each
14 fiscal year to the Legislative Council on program activities and the
15 expenditure of funds from the Psychiatric Research Institute and Department
16 of Pediatrics appropriation for Building Effective Services for Trauma
17 programs for children and adolescents.

18 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2017~~

21 SECTION 46. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
22 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ABUSED
23 CHILDREN AND ADOLESCENTS SERVICES PROGRAM FUNDING PROVISION. In the event
24 the amount of general revenue distributed to the University of Arkansas
25 Medical Center Fund for the Department of Pediatrics and the Psychiatric
26 Research Institute each fiscal year is at least equal to the amount
27 distributed during the 2012-13 fiscal year, an amount not less than seven
28 hundred thousand dollars (\$700,000) shall be allocated and made available as
29 follows: four hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$450,000) each fiscal year
30 shall be made available exclusively to support the purposes and goals to
31 improve screening, monitoring and care for abused children and adolescents
32 through the Child Safety Centers or the University of Arkansas for Medical
33 Sciences as referred by the Child Safety Centers. Maintenance of statewide
34 screening and assessment protocols as well as evidence-based training of
35 mental health professionals are to be considered critical components of the
36 overall goals. For the provision of assessment and therapeutic services,

1 these funds are to be provided to the Child Safety Centers through contracts
2 from the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences. The contracts will
3 stipulate the terms of the agreement and reporting requirements; an amount
4 not to exceed fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) may be utilized for
5 administrative costs as may be necessary to administer the program or if
6 determined not to be needed for administrative costs may be placed in reserve
7 for future needs of the program. The remaining two hundred thousand dollars
8 (\$200,000) shall be allocated and made available to the Department of
9 Pediatrics for expenses for medical examinations, consultation, education and
10 training as stipulated in the terms of agreement between the Chancellor of
11 the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences and the Department of
12 Pediatrics.

13 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2017~~
14 2018 through June 30, ~~2018~~ 2019.

15
16 SECTION 47. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
17 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
18 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
19 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
20 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
21 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures
22 Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this
23 State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of
24 Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied
25 with in disbursement of said funds.

26
27 SECTION 48. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
28 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
29 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for
30 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
31 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
32 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
33 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
34 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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36 SECTION 49. EFFECTIVE DATE. This act is effective on and after July 1,
