11 SECTION 72. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
12 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. BLANKET
13 BOND PROGRAM. The Director of the Department of Finance and Administration
14 is authorized to transfer Appropriation between the Blanket Surety Bond
15 Program appropriations authorized for State Employees (Appropriation 2DM),
16 County Employees (Appropriation 2DN), Municipal Employees (Appropriation 2DP)
17 and Public School Employees (Appropriation 2DQ).

18 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
19 2019 through June 30, 2020.

20
21 SECTION 73. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
22 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER
23 PROCEDURES - VARIOUS TEMPORARY APPROPRIATION FOR STATE AGENCIES AND
24 INSTITUTIONS. (i) In the event that sufficient appropriation is not provided
25 by the General Assembly for any state agency or institution, an agency or
26 institution may request a transfer of appropriation, as provided in the
27 Various Temporary Appropriation for State Agencies and Institutions
28 Appropriation Section of this Act, from the Chief Fiscal Officer of the
29 State, stating clearly the amount requested, purpose and any additional
30 information requested by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State.
31 (ii) After reviewing a request the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State may
32 deny, modify or approve the agencies or institutions request based on the
33 estimated amount of appropriation needed and currently available, purpose,
34 estimated funding available and preferred spending priority. Upon approval
35 or modification of a request by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and
36 after meeting the requirements of subsection (iii) or (iv) herein, the

1 Department of Finance and Administration shall establish the transfer of
2 appropriation on the books of the Department of Finance and Administration
3 and the State Auditor, in compliance with the applicable classifications of
4 appropriations as enumerated in Arkansas Code 19-4-521 through 19-4-525.
5 (iii) Any request as authorized in subsection (ii) herein in the last month
6 of a fiscal year that is equal to or less than 10% of the authorized
7 commitment item that the appropriation is requested for, shall be reported to
8 the Arkansas Legislative Council or if next meeting in Regular or Fiscal
9 Session the Joint Budget Committee at the next meeting.
10 (iv) Any request approved as authorized in subsection (ii) herein that is
11 not on the last month of a fiscal year or is greater than 10% on the last
12 month of a fiscal year as defined in subsection (iii) herein, or establishes
13 a new commitment item or new appropriation shall require prior approval by
14 the Arkansas Legislative Council or if meeting in Regular or Fiscal Session
15 the Joint Budget Committee.
16 (v) Any appropriation approved as authorized in this Section shall not be
17 carried forward to the next fiscal year and shall be identified as a change
18 level increase by the state agency or institution, if requested.
19 (vi) Determining the maximum amount of appropriation for a state agency or
20 institution each fiscal year is the prerogative of the General Assembly.
21 This is usually accomplished by delineating such maximums in the
22 appropriation act(s) for a state agency or institution. Further, the General
23 Assembly has determined that a state agency or institution may operate more
24 efficiently if some flexibility is provided to the state agency or
25 institution authorizing broad powers under this section. Therefore, it is
26 both necessary and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight
27 by requiring prior approval of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget
28 Committee as provided by this section. The requirement of approval by the
29 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is not a severable part of this
30 section. If the requirement or approval by the Legislative Council or Joint
31 Budget Committee is ruled unconstitutional by a court of competent
32 jurisdiction, this entire section is void.

33 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2019
34 through June 30, 2020.

35
36 SECTION 74. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds

1 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
2 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
3 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
4 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
5 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
6 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
7 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
8 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

9
10 SECTION 75. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
11 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
12 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for
13 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
14 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
15 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
16 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
17 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

18
19 SECTION 76. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
20 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits
21 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
22 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2019 is essential to the operation of
23 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
24 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
25 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2019 could work irreparable harm
26 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
27 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
28 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
29 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2019.
