16 BOND PROGRAM. The Director of the Department of Finance and Administration
17 is authorized to transfer Appropriation between the Blanket Surety Bond
18 Program appropriations authorized for State Employees (Appropriation 2DM),
19 County Employees (Appropriation 2DN), Municipal Employees (Appropriation 2DP)
20 and Public School Employees (Appropriation 2DQ).

21 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
22 2019 through June 30, 2020.

23

24 SECTION 73. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
25 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER
26 PROCEDURES - VARIOUS TEMPORARY APPROPRIATION FOR STATE AGENCIES AND
27 INSTITUTIONS. (i) In the event that sufficient appropriation is not provided
28 by the General Assembly for any state agency or institution, an agency or
29 institution may request a transfer of appropriation, as provided in the
30 Various Temporary Appropriation for State Agencies and Institutions
31 Appropriation Section of this Act, from the Chief Fiscal Officer of the
32 State, stating clearly the amount requested, purpose and any additional
33 information requested by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State.
34 (ii) After reviewing a request the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State may
35 deny, modify or approve the agencies or institutions request based on the
36 estimated amount of appropriation needed and currently available, purpose,

1 estimated funding available and preferred spending priority. Upon approval
2 or modification of a request by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and
3 after meeting the requirements of subsection (iii) herein, the Department of
4 Finance and Administration shall establish the transfer of appropriation on
5 the books of the Department of Finance and Administration and the State
6 Auditor, in compliance with the applicable classifications of appropriations
7 as enumerated in Arkansas Code 19-4-521 through 19-4-525.

8 (iii) Any request approved as authorized in subsection (ii) herein,
9 including requests that establish a new commitment item or new appropriation
10 shall require prior approval by the Arkansas Legislative Council or if
11 meeting in Regular or Fiscal Session the Joint Budget Committee.

12 (iv) Any appropriation approved as authorized in this Section shall not be
13 carried forward to the next fiscal year and shall be identified as a change
14 level increase by the state agency or institution, if requested.

15 (v) Determining the maximum amount of appropriation for a state agency or
16 institution each fiscal year is the prerogative of the General Assembly.
17 This is usually accomplished by delineating such maximums in the
18 appropriation act(s) for a state agency or institution. Further, the General
19 Assembly has determined that a state agency or institution may operate more
20 efficiently if some flexibility is provided to the state agency or
21 institution authorizing broad powers under this section. Therefore, it is
22 both necessary and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight
23 by requiring prior approval of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget
24 Committee as provided by this section. The requirement of approval by the
25 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is not a severable part of this
26 section. If the requirement or approval by the Legislative Council or Joint
27 Budget Committee is ruled unconstitutional by a court of competent
28 jurisdiction, this entire section is void.

29 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2019
30 through June 30, 2020.

32 *SECTION 74. CODE AMENDMENT. Arkansas Code § 14-171-215(a)(5),*
33 *concerning the payments to the Arkansas State Fair and Livestock Show*
34 *Association from the City-County Tourist Facilities Aid Fund, is amended to*
35 *read as follows:*

36 (M) Eight hundred eighty-seven thousand nine hundred eight

1 dollars (\$887,908) in the fiscal year 2021;

2 (N) Eight hundred eighty-seven thousand nine hundred eight
3 dollars (\$887,908) in the fiscal year 2022;

4 (O) Eight hundred eighty-seven thousand nine hundred eight
5 dollars (\$887,908) in the fiscal year 2023;

6 (P) Eight hundred eighty-seven thousand nine hundred eight
7 dollars (\$887,908) in the fiscal year 2024; and

8 (Q) Eight hundred eighty-seven thousand nine hundred eight
9 dollars (\$887,908) in the fiscal year 2025.

10
11 SECTION 75. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
12 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
13 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
14 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
15 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
16 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
17 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
18 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
19 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

20
21 SECTION 76. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
22 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
23 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for
24 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
25 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
26 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
27 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
28 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

29
30 SECTION 77. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
31 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits
32 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
33 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2019 is essential to the operation of
34 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
35 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
36 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2019 could work irreparable harm

1 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
2 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
3 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
4 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2019.
