- l pregnancy or for correcting sterility or infertility or to tender service or
- 2 recommendations with regard to any of the above;
- 3 (B) To represent, directly or indirectly, publicly or
- 4 privately, an ability and willingness to do any act described in subdivision
- 5 (9)(A) of this section;
- 6 (C) The use of any title, words, abbreviation, or letters
- 7 in a manner or under circumstances which induce the belief that the person
- 8 using them is qualified to do any act described in subdivision (9)(A) of this
- 9 section. Such use shall be prima facie evidence of the intention to represent
- 10 oneself as engaged in the practice of veterinary medicine; and
- 11 (D) Collecting blood or other samples for the purpose of
- 12 diagnosing disease or other conditions. This shall not apply to:
- 13 (i) Unlicensed personnel employed by the United

15	discussing a veterinarian's diagnosis or treatment without the express
16	permission of the veterinarian;
17	(4)(A) Any offense punishable by incarceration in the Department
18	of Correction or federal prison.
19	(B) A copy of the record of conviction, certified by the
20	clerk of the court entering the conviction, shall be evidence;
21	(5) Inability to practice as a veterinary technologist or a
22	veterinary technician specialist with reasonable skill and safety to patients
