 11 "Extra Help", payable from funds appropriated herein for such purposes: two
 12 hundred thirty-one (231) temporary or part-time employees, when needed, at
 13 rates of pay not to exceed those provided in the Uniform Classification and
 14 Compensation Act, or its successor, or this act for the appropriate
 15 classification.

17 SECTION 4. EXTRA HELP - TRAUMA SYSTEM. There is hereby authorized, for
 18 the Department of Health - Trauma System for the 2019-2020 fiscal year, the
 19 following maximum number of part-time or temporary employees, to be known as
 20 "Extra Help", payable from funds appropriated herein for such purposes: two
 21 (2) temporary or part-time employees, when needed, at rates of pay not to
 22 exceed those provided in the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act, or
 23 its successor, or this act for the appropriate classification.

25 SECTION 5. APPROPRIATION - OPERATIONS. There is hereby appropriated,

34 SECTION 12. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 35 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. NUCLEAR
 36 DISASTER PLANNING GRANTS. The funds appropriated for Grants for Nuclear

1 Planning shall be disbursed to those counties in this State which are
2 required by state or federal regulation to maintain a Radiological Response
3 Plan because of their close proximity to a nuclear electricity generating
4 facility, and shall be issued solely for the purpose of defraying the cost of
5 preparing for and participating in actual nuclear disaster incidents or
6 practice nuclear disaster exercises. Each county shall be eligible for that
7 proportion of these funds as is determined fair and necessary under
8 guidelines to be developed by the Arkansas Department of Health. However, a
9 minimum of \$5,000 per county of said funds shall be utilized to support and
10 operate a County Emergency Management Office. These county offices shall be

5 FORWARD OF FUNDS.

6 (a) Except as authorized in subsection (c) of this section, the
7 Department of Health is authorized to carry forward any unspent funds
8 remaining in the Public Health Fund on June 30, ~~2019~~ 2020 allocated for the
9 support of the Trauma System to be used for the same purposes in the next
10 fiscal year.

11 (b) Any carry forward of unexpended balance of funding as authorized
12 herein, may be carried forward under the following conditions:

13 (1) Prior to June 30, ~~2019~~ 2020, the agency shall by written
14 statement set forth its reason(s) for the need to carry forward said funding
15 to the Office of Budget of the Department of Finance and Administration;

16 (2) The Office of Budget of the Department of Finance and
17 Administration shall report to the Legislative Council all amounts carried
18 forward by the September meeting of the Legislative Council or the Joint
19 Budget Committee meeting which report shall include the name of the agency,
20 board, commission, or institution and the amount of funding carried forward,
21 the program name or line item, the funding source and a copy of the written
22 request set forth in subdivision (b)(1) of this section;

23 (3) Each agency, board, commission, or institution shall provide
24 a written report to the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee
25 containing all information set forth in subdivision (b)(2) of this section,
26 along with a written statement as to the current status of the project,
27 contract, purpose, etc., for which the carry forward was originally requested
28 no later than thirty (30) days prior to the time the agency, board,
29 commission, or institution presents its budget request to the Legislative
30 Council or Joint Budget Committee, or both; and

31 (4) Thereupon, the Department of Finance and Administration
32 shall include all information obtained in subdivision (b)(3) of this section
33 in the budget manuals or a statement of non-compliance by the agency, board,

18 SECTION 19. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

20 CARE PROGRAM. The Arkansas Department of Health shall annually budget,

33 SECTION 20. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
34 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ARKANSAS
35 WORKS AND ARKANSAS HEALTH INSURANCE MARKETPLACE RESTRICTIONS. (a) As used in
36 this section, "Arkansas Works" means the Arkansas Works established under the

1 Arkansas Works Act of 2016, Arkansas Code § 23-61-1001 et seq.

2 (b)(1) Determining the maximum number of employees, the maximum amount
3 of appropriation, for what purposes an appropriation is authorized, and
4 general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year is the
5 prerogative of the General Assembly.

6 (2) The purposes of subdivision (b)(1) of this section are
7 typically accomplished by:

8 (A) Identifying the purpose in the appropriation act;

9 (B) Delineating such maximums in the appropriation act for
10 a state agency; and

11 (C) Delineating the general revenue allocations authorized
12 for each fund and fund account by amendment to the Revenue Stabilization Law,
13 Arkansas Code § 19-5-101 et seq.

14 (3) It is both necessary and appropriate that the General
15 Assembly restrict the use of appropriations authorized in this act.

16 (c)(1) Except as provided in this subsection, the Department of Health
17 shall not allocate, budget, expend, or utilize any appropriation authorized
18 by the General Assembly for the purpose of advertisement, promotion, or other
19 activities designed to promote or encourage enrollment in the Arkansas Health
20 Insurance Marketplace or Arkansas Works, including without limitation:

21 (A) Unsolicited communications mailed to potential
22 recipients;

23 (B) Television, radio, or online commercials;

24 (C) Billboard or mobile billboard advertising;

25 (D) Advertisements printed in newspapers, magazines, or
26 other print media; and

27 (E) Internet websites and electronic media.

28 (2) This subsection does not prohibit the department from:

29 (A) Direct communications with:

30 (i) Licensed insurance agents; and

31 (ii) Persons licensed by the department;

32 (B) Solicited communications with potential recipients;

33 (C)(i) Responding to an inquiry regarding the coverage for
34 which a potential recipient might be eligible, including without limitation
35 providing educational materials or information regarding any coverage for
36 which the individual might qualify.

1 (ii) Educational materials and information
2 distributed under subdivision (c)(2)(C)(i) of this section shall contain only
3 factual information and shall not contain subjective statements regarding the
4 coverage for which the potential recipient might be eligible; and

5 (D) Using an Internet website for the exclusive purpose of
6 enrolling individuals in the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace or
7 Arkansas Works.

8 (d) The Department of Health shall not apply for or accept any funds,
9 including without limitation federal funds, for the purpose of advertisement,
10 promotion, or other activities designed to promote or encourage enrollment in
11 the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace or Arkansas Works.

12 (e)(1) Except as provided in subdivision (e)(2) of this section, the
13 Department of Health shall not:

14 (A)(i) Except as provided in subdivision (e)(1)(A)(ii) of
15 this section, allocate, budget, expend, or utilize an appropriation
16 authorized by the General Assembly for the purpose of funding activities of
17 navigators, guides, certified application counselors, and certified licensed
18 producers under the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace Navigator, Guide,
19 and Certified Application Counselors Act, Arkansas Code § 23-64-601 et seq.

20 (ii) Subdivision (e)(1)(A)(i) of this section does
21 not apply to regulatory and training responsibilities related to navigators,
22 guides, certified application counselors, and certified licensed producers;
23 and

24 (B) Apply for or accept any funds, including without
25 limitation federal funds, for the purpose of funding activities of
26 navigators, guides, certified application counselors, and certified licensed
27 producers under the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace Navigator, Guide,
28 and Certified Application Counselors Act, Arkansas Code § 23-64-601 et seq.

29 (2) Subdivision (e)(1) of this section does not apply to
30 certified application counselors at health related institutions, including
31 without limitation the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences.

32 (f) An appropriation authorized by the General Assembly shall not be
33 subject to the provisions allowed through reallocation of resources or
34 transfer of appropriation authority for the purpose of transferring an
35 appropriation to any other appropriation authorized for the Department of
36 Health to be allocated, budgeted, expended, or utilized in a manner

1 prohibited by this section.

2 (g) The provisions of this section are severable, and the invalidity
3 of any subsection or subdivision of this section shall not affect other
4 provisions of the section that can be given effect without the invalid
5 provision.

6 (h) This section expires on June 30, ~~2019~~2020.

7
8 SECTION 21. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
9 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
10 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
11 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
12 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
13 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
14 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
15 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
16 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

17
18 SECTION 22. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
19 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
20 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for
21 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
22 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
23 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
24 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
25 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

26
27 SECTION 23. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
28 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits
29 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
30 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2019 is essential to the operation of
31 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
32 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
33 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2019 could work irreparable harm
34 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
35 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
36 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health

and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2019.

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
