TRANSFERS 4 AUTHORIZED. Any savings in the amount appropriated in the Operations 5 appropriation section for the Regular Salaries line item, Overtime line item, 6 Personal Services Matching line item, or any sub-item of the Maintenance and 7 General Operation line item, may be transferred by the Director of the 8 Arkansas Department of Transportation to any sub-item of the Maintenance and 9 General Operation line item, upon review by the Arkansas Legislative Council 10 or Joint Budget Committee and by notifying the Director of Finance and 11 Administration and the Auditor of State to transfer said savings to a 12 specific sub-item of the Maintenance and General Operation line item and make 13 it available for said purpose during the then current fiscal year. 14 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2018 15 2019 through June 30, 2019 2020.

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17 SECTION 16. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 18 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. PERSONAL 19 SERVICES MATCHING TRANSFER. Provided that in the event amounts appropriated 20 in the Personal Services Matching line item of the Operations appropriation 21 section are insufficient in the fiscal year to pay the amounts at the rates 22 stipulated by law to be paid for each of these items, an additional amount as 23 determined and requested by the Director of the Arkansas Department of 24 Transportation, and upon review by the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint 25 Budget Committee, will be transferred by the Director of Finance and 26 Administration and the Auditor of State from the Maintenance and General 27 Operation line items to the Personal Services Matching line item of the 28 Operations appropriation section to enable the Arkansas Department of 29 Transportation to pay the required matching funds.

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33 SECTION 17. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds 34 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency 35 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and 36 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and

Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

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7 SECTION 18. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General 8 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations 9 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for 10 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive 11 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget 12 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or 13 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative 14 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. 15

16 SECTION 19. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the 17 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits 18 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the 19 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2019 is essential to the operation of 20 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the 21 22 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2019 could work irreparable harm 23 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental 24 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act 25 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health 26 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2019. 27 28 29 30 31 32 33 34
