23	(a)(1) All firearms $\underline{A \text{ firearm}}$ used in the commission of a crime that

25	shall be delivered to the State Crime Laboratory within thirty (30) calendar

- 2 (2) The laboratory shall coordinate with all participating
- 3 agencies when investigations require the use of the National Integrated
- 4 Bullet Identification Network's computer database.
- 5 (3) The laboratory shall provide written analysis reports and
- 6 experts for testimony when feasible.
- 7 (4) After completion of the <u>forensic</u> testing, the firearms
- 8 <u>firearm</u> shall be returned to the law enforcement agencies agency that
- 9 submitted the firearm for forensic testing.
- 10 (5) When the law enforcement agency regains possession of the
- 11 firearm, the law enforcement agency shall immediately notify the owner,
- 12 unless the owner is prohibited by law from possessing the firearm, that the
- owner may regain possession of the firearm at the offices of the law
- 14 enforcement agency.
- 15 (c) A law enforcement agency in this state may request the assistance
- 16 of the Department of Arkansas State Police in tracing a firearm.
- 17 (d) A firearm seized by the Arkansas State Game and Fish Commission
- 18 for violation of a commission regulation is exempt from this section.
- 19 (e) The State Crime Laboratory Board may adopt rules for the
- 20 implementation of this section, including, but not limited to, without
- 21 <u>limitation</u> rules regarding <u>forensic</u> testing <u>of a firearm</u> and submission
- 22 procedures for submission of a firearm.
