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26	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:	
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28	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 17-1-107 is amended to read as follows:	
29	17-1-107. Reinstatement of licenses - Definition.	
30	(a)(1) It is not the intent of the General Assembly to cause the	
31	licensing entity to engage in simple comparisons of the required hours of	
32	training and other personal qualifications under Arkansas's occupational	
33	licensing statutes with those qualifications required in the state where the	
34	person is credentialed.	
35	(2) It is the intent of the General Assembly to ensure that a	
36	person may be credentialed to work in Arkansas if he or she generally	



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1	demonstrates the skills and ethics required by state law based on the
2	person's experience and credentials in another state.
3	(b)(a) A licensing entity shall by rule adopt reduced requirements for
4	reinstatement of a license, registration, or certification for a person who:
5	(1) Demonstrates that he or she:
6	(A) Was previously licensed, registered, or certified to
7	practice in the field of his or her profession at any time in this state;
8	(B) Held his or her license in good standing at the time
9	of licensing;
10	(C) Did not have his or her license revoked for:
11	(i) An act of bad faith; or
12	(ii) A violation of law, rule, or ethics;
13	(D) Is not holding a suspended or probationary license in
14	any state; and
15	(E) Is sufficiently competent in his or her field; and
16	(2) Pays any reinstatement fee required by law.
17	(c)(b) The licensing entity may require that sufficient competency in
18	a particular field be demonstrated by:
19	 Proficiency testing;
20	(2) Letters of recommendation; or
21	(3) Both proficiency testing and letters of recommendation.
22	<pre>(d)(l)(c)(l) Except as provided under subdivision (c)(2)(b) of this</pre>
23	section, the licensing entity shall not require a person who meets the
24	requirements of subsection (a) of this section to participate in the
25	apprenticeship, education, or training required as a prerequisite to
26	licensing, registration, or certification of a new professional in the field.
27	(2) The licensing entity may require the person to participate
28	in continuing education or training if the continuing education or training
29	is required for all professionals in the field to maintain the license,

31	(e)(d) A person shall not be required to comply with requirements
32	under this section to obtain reinstatement of his or her license,
33	registration, or certification if the person meets the requirements for

35	(f)(e) If a criminal background check is required of <u>an applicant for</u>

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1 holding a license, registration, or certification, then the licensing entity 2 may require a person seeking reinstatement under this section to meet the 3 same criminal background check requirements as the applicant for an original 4 license, registration, or certification, or as the person currently holding a 5 license, registration, or certification. 6 (g)(f)(1) As used in this section, "licensing entity" means an agency, 7 board, commission, department, committee, or other authority of the 8 government of the State of Arkansas, whether within or subject to review by 9 another agency, except the General Assembly, the courts, and the Governor, 10 that has the duty to license, register, certify, or otherwise approve a person to work in a particular field or industry. 11 12 (2) As used in subdivision (f)(1) of this section "agency" 13 does not include the General Assembly, the courts, or the Governor. 14 15 SECTION 2. Endorsement, recognition, and reciprocity of licenses, 17 registrations, or certifications. 18 19 (a)(1) It is the intent of the General Assembly to ensure that a 20 person may be credentialed to work in Arkansas if he or she generally 21 demonstrates the skills and ethics required by state law based on the 22 person's experience and credentials in another state. 23 (2) It is not the intent of the General Assembly to cause the licensing entity to engage in simple comparisons of the required hours of 24 25 training and other personal qualifications under Arkansas's occupational licensing statutes with those qualifications required in the state where the 26 27 person is credentialed. (b)(1) As used in this section "licensing entity" means an agency, 28 29 board, commission, department, committee, or other authority of the 30 government of the State of Arkansas, whether within or subject to review by another agency, that has the duty to license, register, certify, or otherwise 31 32 approve a person to work in a particular field or industry. 33 (2) As used in subdivision (g)(1) of this section "agency" does not include the General Assembly, the courts, or the Governor. 34 35 (c) A licensing entity shall by rule adopt the least restrictive requirements for licensing, registration, or certification for a person who: 36

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1	(1) Demonstrates that he or she:
2	(A) Was previously licensed, registered, or certified for
3	a term specified by rule of the licensing entity to practice in the field of
4	his or her profession in another state that has substantially similar
5	licensure, registration, or certification requirements;
6	(B) Holds his or her license in good standing;
7	(C) Has not had his or her license revoked for:
8	(i) An act of bad faith; or
9	(ii) A violation of law, rule, or ethics;
10	(D) Is not holding a suspended or probationary license in
11	any state; and
12	(E) Is sufficiently competent in his or her field; and
13	(2) Pays any licensing, registration, or certification fee
14	required by law.
15	(d)(1)(A) A licensing entity shall comply with the requirements under
16	subsection (b) of this section by adopting a rule that is least restrictive
17	that allows for state-to-state reciprocity.
18	(B) The rule under subdivision (d)(l)(A) of this section
19	shall provide the procedure by which a licensing entity shall grant a ninety-
20	day, or any additional time the licensing entity deems necessary, temporary
21	reciprocal license or permit to a person for the person to complete the
22	licensure process under subsection (c) of this section by presenting evidence
23	of current and active licensure, registration, or certification in another
24	<u>state that has substantially similar licensure, registration, or</u>
25	certification requirements.
26	(2) If a state does not require licensing, registration, or
27	certification for a profession that requires licensing, registration, or
28	certification in this state, a licensing entity shall adopt a rule that is
29	least restrictive to permit a person to obtain licensing, registration, or
30	certification upon demonstrating sufficient competency for that profession in
31	<u>this state.</u>
32	(3) The licensing entity may require additional state-specific
33	education for persons certified or licensed in other states that do not offer
34	reciprocity similar to reciprocity under this section to persons licensed or
35	certified in this state.
36	(e)(l) Except as provided under subdivision (e)(2) of this section, a

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1	licensing entity shall not require a person who meets the requirements of
2	subsection (c) of this section to participate in the apprenticeship,
3	education, or training required as a prerequisite to licensing, registration,
4	or certification of a new professional in the field.
5	(2) The licensing entity may require the person to participate
6	in continuing education or training if the continuing education or training
7	is required for all professionals in the field to maintain the license,
8	registration, or certification.
9	(f) If a criminal background check is required of an applicant for an
10	original license, registration, or certification, or of a person currently
11	holding a license, registration, or certification, then the licensing entity
