27	SECTION 1. Ar	kansas Code § 9-28-409(b)(3)(A), concern	ing criminal
28	record and child mal	treatment checks, is amended to read as	follows:
29	(3)(A)	The owner or operator of a child welfare	agency shall
30	maintain on file, su	bject to inspection by the board, eviden	ice that
31	Department of Arkans	as State Police criminal records checks	have been
32	initiated on all per	sons required to be checked and the resu	lts of the checks
33	all persons required	to be checked with the Identification B	ureau of the
34	Department of Arkans	as State Police under this subsection ha	ve been approved

2	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 9-28-409(c)(2)(B), concerning criminal	
3	record and child maltreatment checks, is amended to read as follows:	
4	(B) The owner or operator of a child welfare agency shall	
5	maintain on file, subject to inspection by the board, evidence that the	
6	Federal Bureau of Investigation's criminal records checks have been initiated	
7	on all persons required to be checked and documentation that the checks have	
8	been completed all persons required to be checked with the Identification	
9	Bureau of the Department of Arkansas State Police under this subsection have	
10	been approved or disqualified in accordance with the rules of the appropriate	
11	licensing or certifying agency.

13	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 9-28-409(d)(2), concerning criminal record	
14	and child maltreatment checks, is amended to read as follows:	
15	(2) The owner or operator of the child welfare agency shall	
16	submit the criminal records check form to the Identification Bureau of the	
17	Department of Arkansas State Police Division of Child Care and Early	
18	Childhood Education of the Department of Human Services for processing within	
19	ten (10) days of hiring the employee or volunteer, who shall remain under	
20	conditional employment or volunteerism until the registry check and criminal	
21	records checks required under this subchapter are completed.	
22		
23	SECTION 4. Arkansas Code Title 19, Chapter 11, Subchapter 2, is	
24	amended to add an additional section to read as follows:	
25	19-11-273. Procurements for services in designated positions and	
26	designated financial and information technology positions.	
27	A contract for services with a person employed or entity employing	
28	persons in a designated position or designated financial or information	
29	technology position as defined in § 21-15-101 shall require compliance with	
30	the registry records check and criminal history records check laws under §	
31	<u>21-15-101</u> et seq.

33	SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 20-33-213(a)(2), concerning the definition	
34	of "service provider" regarding criminal background checks for persons caring	
35	for the elderly, is amended to read as follows:	

(2) "Service provider" means any of the following:

I	(A) A home- and community-based health services provider		
2	certified by the Division of Aging, Adult, and Behavioral Health Services of		
3	the Department of Human Services;		
4	(B) A home healthcare service services agency as defined		
5	by § 20-10-801;		
6	(C) A hospice program as defined by § 20-7-117; or		
7	(D) A long-term care facility as defined by § 20-10-702.		
8			
9	SECTION 6. Arkansas Code § 20-38-103(a)(3) and (4), concerning		
10	criminal history records checks for applicants and employees of service		
11	providers, are amended to read as follows:		
12	(3) Except as provided in subdivision (a)(4) of this section, if		
13	the service provider can verify that the applicant has lived continuously in		
14	the state for the past five (5) years, the service provider shall require the		
15	applicant to submit a criminal history records check form and shall, in		
16	accordance with the rules of the appropriate licensing or certifying agency:		
17	(A) Initiate a state criminal history records check on the		
18	applicant with the Identification Bureau of the Department of Arkansas State		
19	Police; and		
20	(B) Conduct a registry <u>records</u> check on the applicant in		
21	accordance with the rules of the appropriate licensing or certifying agency.		
22	(4) If the service provider cannot verify that the applicant has		
23	lived continuously in the state for the past five (5) years or if the		
24	applicant is seeking employment at a child care facility as defined by § 20-		
25	78-202 or a church-exempt child care facility as recognized under § 20-78-		
26	209, regardless of the length of time that the applicant has lived in the		
27	state, the service provider shall require the applicant to submit a criminal		
28	history records check form and a complete set of fingerprints and shall:		
29	(A) Initiate a state criminal history records check on the		
30	applicant with the Identification Bureau of the Department of Arkansas State		
31	Police;		
32	(B) Forward the applicant's fingerprints to the		
33	Identification Bureau of the Department of Arkansas State Police to initiate		
34	a national criminal history records check Initiate a fingerprint-based		
35	criminal history records check performed by the Federal Bureau of		
36	<u>Investigation</u> on the applicant; and		

1	(C) Conduct a registry records check on the applicant in
2	accordance with the rules of the appropriate licensing or certifying agency.

4	SECTION 7. Arkansas Code § 20-38-103(c)(2)(B), concerning criminal
5	history records checks for applicants and employees of service providers, is
6	amended to read as follows:
7	(B) The entity shall:
8	(i) Maintain maintain all documentation regarding
9	criminal history records checks for each temporary employee placed with a
10	service provider;
11	(ii) Indicate whether each temporary employee placed
12	with a service provider has been approved or disqualified in accordance with
13	the rules of the appropriate licensing or certifying agency; and
14	(iii) Provide and shall provide copies of the
15	documentation to the service provider, which shall be made available to the
16	appropriate licensing or certifying agency upon request.
17	
18	SECTION 8. Arkansas Code § 20-38-103(e)(1)(B), concerning criminal
19	history records checks for applicants and employees of service providers, is
20	amended to read as follows:
21	(B) When a service provider initiates <u>licensing or</u>
22	certifying agency submits a request for a national criminal history records
23	check on an applicant for employment with or an employee of the service
24	provider, the Identification Bureau of the Department of Arkansas State
25	Police shall issue a report to the licensing or certifying agency within ten
26	(10) days after receipt of the results of the national criminal history
27	records check from the Federal Bureau of Investigation.
28	
29	SECTION 9. Arkansas Code § 20-38-106(a), concerning evidence of
30	records checks, is amended to read as follows:
31	(a) A service provider shall maintain on file, subject to inspection
32	by the Arkansas Crime Information Center, the Identification Bureau of the
33	Department of Arkansas State Police, or the licensing or certifying agency
34	evidence that criminal history records checks have been completed on all
35	operators, applicants for employment, and employees of the service provider
36	and evidence that all operators, applicants for employment, and employees of

the rules of the appropriate licensing or certifying agency. SECTION 10. Arkansas Code § 21-15-101(6), concerning the definition of "designated position" regarding criminal background checks for employees, is amended to read as follows: (6) "Designated position" means a position in which a person is employed by or contracting with a contractor of a state agency or a state agency to provide care, supervision, treatment, or any other services to the elderly, to mentally ill or-developmentally disabled persons, to persons with mental illnesses, or to children who reside in any state-operated facility or a position in which the applicant, contractor, subcontractor, or employee will have direct contact with a child or a person who is elderly, mentally ill, or developmentally disabled;
