8	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 20-13-1502(a)(1), concerning testing of		
9	possible exposure of emergency response workers to airborne or blood-borne		
10	diseases, is amended to read as follows:		
11	(a)(1) Consent is not required for a healthcare provider or healthcare		
12	facility to test an individual for an airborne or blood-borne disease when a		
13	healthcare provider, or emergency		
14	response worker has a type of contact with an individual that may transmit an		
15	airborne or blood-borne disease, as determined by a physician in his or her		
16	medical judgment.		
17			
18	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 20-15-905(a) and (b), concerning the		
19	definitions and testing under the HIV Shield Law, are amended to read as		
20	follows:		
21	(a) As used in this section:		
22	(1) "Emergency response worker" means:		
23	(A) Paramedics;		
24	(B) Emergency response employees;		
25	(C) Firefighters;		
26	(D) First response workers;		
27	(E) Emergency medical technicians;		
28	(F) Emergency medical services personnel;		
29	(G) Volunteers making an authorized emergency response;		
30	(H) Law enforcement officers and personnel; and		
31	(I) A person rendering services as a "Good Samaritan"		
32	under the "Good Samaritan" law, § 17-95-101;		
33	(1) "Healthcare provider" means any physician, nurse,		
34	paramedic, or other person providing medical, nursing, or other healthcare		
35	services of any kind;		
36	(2)(3) "Health facility" means a hospital, nursing home, blood		

1	pank, blood center, sperm bank, or other healthcare institution;		
2	(3)(4) "HIV" means the human immunodeficiency virus or any other		
3	identified causative agent of acquired immunodeficiency syndrome (AIDS);		
4	(4)(5) "Person" includes any natural person, partnership,		
5	association, joint venture, trust, governmental entity, public or private		
6	corporation, health facility, or other legal entity; and		
7	(5) (6) "Test" or "HIV test" means a test to determine the		
8	presence of the antibody or antigen to HIV or of HIV infection.		
9	(b)(1) Consent is not required for a healthcare provider or health		
10	facility to perform a test when a healthcare provider, or employee of a		
11	health facility, or emergency response worker is involved in a direct skin o		
12	mucous membrane contact with the blood or bodily fluids of an individual		
13	which is of a nature that may transmit HIV, as determined by a physician in		
14	his or her medical judgment.		
15	(2)(A) The results of the test shall be provided by the person		
16	ordering the test to the affected healthcare provider or employee of a health		
17	facility, to the healthcare provider's or employee's physician, to the		
18	individual tested, and to the individual's physician.		
19	(B) Appropriate counseling shall be provided along with		
20	the test results.		
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
