- 5 to assault or abuse any student or teacher, principal, superintendent, or

- 7 (B) Possession by students of any firearm or other weapon
- 8 prohibited upon the school campus by law or by policies adopted by the school

- 12 (D) Willfully or intentionally damaging, destroying, or

- SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 6-18-502(c), concerning the development of
- 16 school district student discipline policies, is amended to add an additional
- 17 subdivision to read as follows:
- 18 (c) The school discipline policies shall:
- 19 (1)(A) Prescribe minimum and maximum penalties, including
- 20 <u>without limitation</u> students' suspension or <u>dismissal</u> <u>expulsion</u> from school,
- 21 for violations of each any of the aforementioned offenses described in
- 22 <u>subdivision (b)(3) of this section</u> and for violations of other practices
- 23 prohibited by school discipline policies;.
- 24 (B) However, the superintendent shall have discretion to
- 25 modify the prescribed penalties for a student on a case-by-case basis;
- 26 (2)(A) Prescribe expulsion from school for a period of not less
- 27 than one (1) year for possession of any firearm or other weapon prohibited
- 28 upon the school campus by law-
- 29 (B) Provided, however, that the superintendent shall have
- 30 discretion to modify such expulsion requirement for a student on a case-by-
- 31 case basis;
- 32 (3) Establish procedures for notice to students and parents of
- 33 charges, hearings, and other due process proceedings to be applicable in the

8	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 6-18-502(f), concerning the development of
9	school district student discipline policies, is amended to read as follows:
10	(f) Teachers and administrators, classified school employees, and
11	volunteers shall be provided with appropriate student discipline, behavioral
12	intervention, and classroom management training and support.
13	
14	SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 6-18-502(h), concerning the development of
15	school district student discipline policies, is amended to read as follows:
16	(h) In developing the state guidelines rules for school district
17	discipline policies, the department shall involve parents, students,
18	teachers, and administrators.
19	
20	SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 6-18-503(a), concerning written student
21	discipline policies, is amended to read as follows:
22	(a)(1)(A) Each school district in this state shall develop written
23	student discipline policies in compliance with the $\frac{\text{guidelines}}{\text{guidelines}}$
24	established by the Department of Education and shall file $\frac{1}{2}$ policies
25	with the department.
26	(B) Guidelines shall The rules required under subdivision
27	(a)(1)(A) of this section may include minimum standards of quality,
28	experimentation with innovative programs, and a system to judge the
29	effectiveness of the program.
30	(C) The discipline policy required under subdivision
31	(a)(1)(A) of this section shall include provisions for÷
32	(i) Placement placement of a student with
33	disciplinary, socially dysfunctional, or behavioral problems not associated
34	with a handicapping condition physical or mental impairment or disability in
35	an alternative learning environment provided by the district; and
36	(ii)(a) Expulsion from school for a period of not

1	less than one (1) year for possession of any firearm or other weapon
2	prohibited upon the school campus by law.
3	(b) Provided, however, that the superintendent
4	shall have discretion to modify such expulsion requirement for a student on a
5	case-by-case basis .
6	(2) Behavioral problems shall include those being at risk of not
7	satisfactorily completing a high school education.
8	
9	SECTION 6. Arkansas Code § 6-18-503(b)(2), concerning written student
10	discipline policies, is amended to read as follows:
11	(2) As used in this section subchapter, "teacher or school
12	administrator" means a:
13	(A) A person employed by a school district and required to
14	have a state-issued educator license as a condition of their employment hold
15	a valid Arkansas standard teaching license, an ancillary license, a
16	provisional license, a technical permit, or an administrator's license issued
17	by the State Board of Education; and
18	(B) A nonlicensed classroom teacher or administrator
19	employed in a position under a waiver from licensure.
20	
21	SECTION 7. Arkansas Code § 6-18-503(d), concerning written student
22	discipline policies, is amended to read as follows:
23	(d) Any amendments or revisions to a school district's student
24	discipline policies shall be developed and adopted in the same manner as the
25	original policies required by \S 6-18-502 and shall be consistent with the
26	guidelines rules established by the department.
27	
28	SECTION 8. Arkansas Code § 6-18-504(b), concerning compliance with
29	written student discipline policies, is amended to read as follows:
30	(b) Any school district failing to file with the department the
31	disciplinary policy required by § 6-18-503 with the department policies that
32	meet the requirements of this subchapter shall have all state aid funds
33	withheld until such disciplinary policy is policies are filed with the

36 SECTION 9. Arkansas Code $\S\S$ 6-18-505 and 6-18-506 are repealed.

2	(a) This section may be cited as the "School Discipline Act".
3	(b) Every teacher is authorized to hold every pupil strictly
4	accountable for any disorderly conduct in school or on the playground of the
5	school, or on any school bus going to or returning from school, or during
6	intermission or recess.
7	(c)(l) Any teacher or school administrator in a school district that
8	authorizes use of corporal punishment in the district's written student
9	discipline policy may use corporal punishment, provided only that the
10	punishment is administered in accord with the district's written student
11	discipline policy, against any pupil in order to maintain discipline and
12	order within the public schools.
13	(2) As used in subdivision (c)(1) of this section, "teacher or
14	school administrator" means those persons employed by a school district and
15	required to have a state-issued educator license as a condition of their
16	employment.

18	6-18-506. School Dismissal Act.
19	(a) This section may be cited as the "School Dismissal Act".
20	(b) Every school district board of directors shall adopt and file with
21	the Department of Education written policies concerning the violation of
22	school standards such as disrespect for teachers and classified school
23	employees, vandalism, and other undesirable behavioral patterns.
24	(c) Every school district board of directors in this state shall hold
25	its pupils strictly accountable for any disorderly conduct in school, on the
26	school grounds, in a school bus, or at any school function.
27	(d) Each school district board of directors shall adopt written rules
28	and regulations delineating its disciplinary policies.
29	(e) The policy may be revised at any time by filing an updated policy
30	with the department.
31	
32	SECTION 10. Arkansas Code § 6-18-507(e)(1), concerning student
33	suspension and expulsion, is repealed.
34	$(e)(1)(\Lambda)$ The superintendent of any school district shall recommend
35	the expulsion of any student from school for a period of not less than one
36	(1) year for possession of any firearm or other weapon prohibited upon the

6	SECTION 11. Arkansas Code § 6-18-507(e)(4), concerning student
7	suspension and expulsion, is amended to read as follows:
8	(4) (A) The department shall establish and maintain a registry of
9	information regarding students who are expelled for possessing a firearm or
10	other prohibited weapon on school property or for committing other acts of
11	violence.
12	(B) The names, addresses, and Social Security numbers of
13	all students listed in the registry shall be available by phone, facsimile,
14	or mail to any school principal in the state.
15	
16	SECTION 12. Arkansas Code § 6-18-510 is amended to read as follows:
17	6-18-510. Enrollment during expulsion — School policy.
18	The board of directors of any school district may adopt a policy that,
19	after a hearing before the board of directors, any person who has been
20	expelled as a student from any other school district may not enroll as a
21	student until the time of the person's expulsion has expired, provided that
22	the receiving school district board of directors affords the student the
23	opportunity for a hearing at the time the student is seeking enrollment.
24	
25	SECTION 13. Arkansas Code § 6-18-511(c)(1), concerning what a
26	principal may do with a student who has been removed by a teacher from a
27	class, is amended to read as follows:
28	(1) Place the student into another appropriate classroom, into
29	in-school suspension, or into the district's alternative learning environment
30	established in accordance with § 6-18-508 [repealed], so long as such
31	placement is consistent with the school district's written student discipline
32	policy;
