8 AN ACT CONCERNING THE SUCCEED SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM; TO
9 REQUIRE THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO CONDUCT A
10 BIENNIAL STUDY AND FILE A BIENNIAL REPORT REGARDING
11 CERTAIN INFORMATION CONCERNING THE SUCCEED
12 SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

15 TO REQUIRE THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO
16 CONDUCT A BIENNIAL STUDY AND FILE A
17 BIENNIAL REPORT REGARDING CERTAIN
18 INFORMATION CONCERNING THE SUCCEED
19 SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM.
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23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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25 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 6, Chapter 41, Subchapter 9, is amended
26 to add an additional section to read as follows:

27 6-41-908. Succeed scholarship biennial study.

28 (a) The Department of Education shall conduct biennially a study of
29 the Succeed Scholarship Program under this subchapter to determine the
30 following information without limitation:

31 (1) The number of students currently participating in the
32 Succeed Scholarship Program;

33 (2) The number of students currently participating in the
34 Succeed Scholarship Program who attended a traditional public school before
35 receiving a Succeed Scholarship;

36 (3) The number of students currently participating in the



1 Succeed Scholarship Program who did not attend a traditional public school
2 before enrolling in a private school upon receipt of a Succeed Scholarship;

3 (4) The number of students who have been dismissed from the
4 Succeed Scholarship Program by a private school that is receiving funds
5 through the Succeed Scholarship Program;

6 (5) The number of students who attended a private school with a
7 Succeed Scholarship and voluntarily returned to a traditional public school;

8 (6) The number of children in foster care who have entered the
9 Succeed Scholarship Program, have been dismissed from the Succeed Scholarship
10 Program, or have been removed from the Succeed Scholarship Program by the
11 Department of Human Services;

12 (7) The number of private schools receiving Succeed Scholarship
13 funds that are currently accredited by the Arkansas Nonpublic School
14 Accrediting Association, Inc., its successor, or another accrediting
15 association recognized by the State Board of Education;

16 (8) The number of private schools receiving Succeed Scholarship
17 funds that are currently unaccredited but have applied for accreditation to
18 the Arkansas Nonpublic Accrediting Association, Inc., its successor, or
19 another accrediting association recognized by the state board, and where
20 those schools are in the accreditation process;

21 (9) The number of students who are enrolled in the Succeed
22 Scholarship Program and have taken a nationally recognized norm-referenced
23 test;

24 (10) The number of students with individualized education
25 programs under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act, 20 U.S.C. §
26 1400 et seq., who are enrolled in the Succeed Scholarship Program and have
27 been exempted from standardized testing requirements under § 6-41-903; and

28 (11) The number of student portfolios that have been developed
29 for exempt students as required under § 6-41-903.

30 (b) In addition to the above information, the Department of Education
31 shall:

32 (1) Review norm-referenced test results and student portfolios;
33 and

34 (2) Provide comparative data regarding student performance in
35 the Succeed Scholarship Program.

36 (c) The Department of Education shall file a final report that

1 includes the findings under subsections (a) and (b) of this section to the
2 Senate Committee on Education and the House Committee on Education on a
3 biennial basis, with the first report due on October 1, 2019.

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
