27	in the first degree if he or she knowingly fails to notify law enforcement of
28	a serious and imminent threat of violence in or targeted at a school that has
29	been communicated to him or her in the course of his or her professional
30	duties.
31	(2) Failure to notify by a mandated reporter in the first degree
32	<u>is a Class A misdemeanor.</u>
33	(c)(l) A person listed as a mandated reporter under subsection (a) of
34	this section commits the offense of failure to notify by a mandated reporter
35	in the second degree if he or she recklessly fails to notify law enforcement
36	of a serious and imminent threat of violence in or targeted at a school that

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1	has been communicated to him or her in course of his or her professional
2	duties.
3	(2) Failure to notify by a mandated reporter in the second
4	<u>degree is a Class C misdemeanor.</u>
5	(d)(l) A person commits the offense of making a false report under
6	this section if he or she purposely makes a report containing a false
7	allegation to law enforcement knowing the allegation to be false.
8	(2) The first offense of making a false report under subdivision
9	(d)(l) of this section is a Class A misdemeanor.
10	(3) A subsequent offense of making a false report under
11	subdivision (d)(l) of this section is a Class D felony.
12	(e) Law enforcement may file a petition in the appropriate court
13	seeking imposition of penalties for a violation of this section.
14	(f) A person who notifies law enforcement, in good faith, of a serious
15	and imminent threat of violence in or targeted at a school that has been
16	communicated to him or her in the course of his or her professional duties is
17	immune from civil or criminal liability.
