22	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code §§ 20-17-701 and 20-17-702 are amended to	
23	read as follows:	
24	20-17-701. Definition - Rights of coroner, justice of the peace, or	
25	courts unaffected.	
26	(a) As used in this subchapter;:	
27	(1) "medical Medical school" means a medical school or school	of
28	osteopathic medicine in this state that is:	
29	$\frac{(1)}{(A)}$ Accredited by an accrediting agency recognized by the	
30	United States Department of Education; or	
31	(2)(B) Approved by the Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating	
32	Board to seek accreditation by an accrediting agency recognized by the Unit	ed
33	States Department of Education-;	
34	(2) "Next of kin" means a spouse, parent, child, sibling, or	
35	person otherwise authorized under § 20-17-702;	
36	(3) "Unclaimed body" means a human body for which the next of

13	death, nor shall this subchapter or affect the right of any court of
14	competent jurisdiction from entering an order affecting the disposition of

17	20-17-702. Search for next of kin.
18	(a)(1) $\underline{(A)}$ The person who assumes original and lawful possession,
19	charge, or control of any body as described in this subchapter shall conduct
20	a diligent search for relatives or next of kin of the deceased, or that
21	person shall request the county sheriff or such other person as may be
22	required by law to conduct the search.
23	(B) The search shall be completed within five (5) days of
24	the death of the deceased or the date of the request, whichever is later.
25	(2) The person conducting the search under subdivision (a)(1) of
26	this section shall make every effort to find the spouse, if any, of the
27	deceased.
28	(3) If the person conducting the search is not satisfied that
29	the putative spouse is, in fact, a legal spouse, or it is determined that no
30	spouse exists, then every effort shall be made to find the parents and
31	siblings, if any, of the deceased.
32	(b) If the identity of the deceased is not known, the investigation
33	shall include, but not be limited to, the taking of fingerprints and sending
34	the fingerprint records to the Federal Bureau of Investigation in Washington,
35	D.C., for identification and filing without limitation submittal of the
36	unidentified deceased to the State Crime Laboratory for forensic examination

- l and scientific identification that may include fingerprinting, dental
- 2 examination, DNA analysis, and entry into the National Missing and
- 3 Unidentified Persons System database.
- 4 (c) If the deceased is eighteen (18) years of age or older, the person
- 5 <u>conducting the search shall conduct a diligent search with the Department of</u>
- 6 <u>Veterans Affairs and the United States Department of Veterans Affairs to</u>
- 7 determine whether the deceased was a veteran under § 20-17-1403.
- 8 (d) If a relative or next of kin does not claim the body, a friend, a
- 9 representative of a fraternal society of which the deceased was a member, a
- 10 <u>veterans service organization as defined in the Missing in America Project</u>
- 11 Act, § 20-17-1401 et seq., the Department of Veterans Affairs, the United
- 12 States Department of Veterans Affairs, or a representative of a charitable or
- 13 religious group may claim the body for burial or cremation at his or her
- 14 expense as described in  $\S 20-17-706(a)-(c)$ .
- 15 (e)(1) If a party listed in subsection (d) of this section or a
- 16 medical school does not claim the body, the person conducting the search
- 17 shall bury, cremate, or donate the unclaimed body within ten (10) days after
- 18 the date of death.
- 19 (2) If the unclaimed body is cremated and a relative, next of
- 20 kin, or other party described in subsection (d) of this section does not
- 21 claim the unclaimed remains within five (5) days of cremation, the coroner
- 22 may dispose of the unclaimed remains in a manner permitted by law.
- 23 (3) If money is discovered on the unclaimed body, the county may
- 24 use the money toward the disposition of the unclaimed body.
- 25 <u>(4) If the deceased had an estate, the estate is responsible for</u>
- 26 reimbursing the county for all reasonable expenses incurred in relation to
- 27 the disposition of the unclaimed body.

- 29 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 20-17-703(a), concerning notice of
- 30 unclaimed bodies to medical schools, is amended to read as follows:
- 31 (a) Any person in charge of a prison, morgue, hospital, funeral
- 32 parlor, or mortuary, any person who is a public officer, agent, or employee
- 33 of the state, any county or municipality, and all persons coming into
- 34 possession, charge, or control of any human body which that is unclaimed for
- 35 burial shall may notify a medical school that the body, if unclaimed, is
- 36 available for use in the advancement or study of medical science.

- (c) If a claim is made, the medical school shall be reimbursed by the claimant for the embalming fee and transportation charges that have been incurred by  $\frac{1}{100}$  the medical school in favor of the body claimed.
- (d) If the <u>unclaimed</u> body is not claimed by any person or organization within <u>ninety (90)</u> <u>fifteen (15)</u> days from the date of arrival at the medical school, then all right, title, and interest in the <u>unclaimed</u> body shall be deemed to vest in the state for the benefit of the medical school, and any living relative, next of kin, friend, or organization shall be deemed to have consented irrevocably to use of the <u>unclaimed</u> body for the advancement or study of medical science.
