5	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code Title 20, Chapter 77, Subchapter 1, is		
6	amended to add an additional section to read as follows:		
7	20-77-135. Medications approved by the United States Food and Drug		
8	Administration for tobacco cessation coverage.		
9	(a) The Department of Human Services shall ensure that the Arkansas		
10	Medicaid Program covers for medications approved by the United States Food		
11	and Drug Administration for tobacco cessation, including without limitation:		
12	(1) Nicotine replacement therapy patches;		
13	(2) Nicotine replacement therapy gum;		
14	(3) Nicotine replacement therapy lozenges;		
15	(4) Nicotine replacement therapy nasal spray;		
16	(5) Nicotine replacement therapy inhalers;		
17	(6) Bupropion; and		
18	(7) Varenicline.		
19	(b) Prior authorization shall not be required for coverage of		
20	medications described in subsection (a) of this section.		
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
