1	(A) The Arkansas Board of Dispensing Opticians;

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22	17-80-503. Powers and duties.	
23	The Arkansas Advisory Council of Healthcare Professions shall:	
24	(1) Receive requests from:	
25	(A) Practitioners seeking to establish new healthcare	
26	professions to be licensed in the state or to establish separate regulatory	
27	entities; and	
28	(B) Healthcare professionals seeking to expand or narrow	
29	the scope of practice of a healthcare profession;	
30	(2) Provide information to the General Assembly and the Director	
31	of the Department of Health based on the findings of the advisory groups;	
32	(3) Review other healthcare-related issues as requested by the	
33	General Assembly or the director;	
34	(4) Notify the Senate Committee on Public Health, Welfare, and	
35	Labor and the House Committee on Public Health, Welfare, and Labor of all	
36	meetings of the council and of the advisory groups;	

1	(5) Present all requests under this subchapter, including any
2	written response to the request described in § 17-80-505, to the Senate
3	Committee on Public Health, Welfare, and Labor and the House Committee on

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9	17-80-504. Advisory groups.
10	(a) The Arkansas Advisory Council of Healthcare Professions shall
11	establish advisory groups to:
12	(1) Evaluate requests received under § 17-80-503(1) based on
13	objective criteria to determine whether the practitioners or healthcare
14	professionals have the requisite knowledge, training, experience, and skills
15	to provide the proposed care;
16	(2) For a request received under § 17-80-503(1), examine:
17	(A) The impact of the requested new healthcare profession,
18	new regulatory entity, or change to a healthcare profession's scope of
19	practice on public health and safety;
20	(B) The economic impact of the requested new healthcare
21	profession, new regulatory entity, or change to a healthcare profession's
22	scope of practice on overall healthcare delivery;
23	(C) Whether the potential benefits of the request outweigh
24	any potential harm; and
25	(D) The extent to which the requested new healthcare
26	profession, new regulatory entity, or change to a healthcare profession's
27	scope of practice would:
28	(i) Affect the availability, accessibility,
29	delivery, and quality of health care in the state; and
30	(ii) Address health disparities and promote health
31	equity;
32	(3) Provide impartial, evidence-based findings and
33	recommendations to the council; and
34	(4) Seek input from academic institutions to assist with
35	analysis of submitted requests.
36	(b)(1) For a request submitted under § 17-80-503(1), the council shall

1	appoint an advisory group composed of the following members:
2	(A) Two (2) members of the profession seeking new
3	licensure, a new regulatory entity, or a modification in scope of practice;
4	(B) Two (2) members of the profession impacted by, or
5	directly in opposition to, the proposed new licensure, new regulatory entity,
6	or modification in scope of practice;
7	(C) Two (2) members who are neither directly or indirectly
8	impacted by the proposed new licensure, new regulatory entity, or
9	modification in scope of practice;
10	(D) The Surgeon General as a nonvoting member; and
11	(E) One (1) member of the community with experience and
12	expertise in health care to be appointed by the Director of the Department of
13	<pre>Health.</pre>
14	(2) A member appointed to an advisory group is not required to
15	be a member of the council.
16	(c) The council may aggregate similar requests for review by a single
17	advisory group.
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19	17-80-505. Requests.
20	(a) On or before May 1 of each even-numbered year, a practitioner or
21	healthcare professional may submit a written request to the Arkansas Advisory
22	Council of Healthcare Professions under § 17-80-503(1) that includes:
23	(1) A description of the requested new healthcare profession,
24	new regulatory entity, or change to a healthcare profession's scope of
25	practice written in plain language;
26	(2) A summary of current state laws and rules governing the
27	<pre>profession, if any;</pre>
28	(3) Current education and training requirements for the
29	<pre>profession;</pre>
30	(4) A history of the scope of practice changes requested or
31	enacted, or both, for the profession;
32	(5) Regional and national trends in the profession; and
33	(6) A summary of relevant practices in other states.
34	(b) On or before August 1 of each even-numbered year, a practitioner
35	or healthcare professional who opposes a request may submit a written
36	response to the council indicating the specific reasons for opposing the

1	request.	
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3	17-80-506. Reporting.	
4	On or before October 31 of each even-numbered year, the Arkansas	
5	Advisory Council of Healthcare Professions shall submit to the Senate	
6	Committee on Public Health, Welfare, and Labor, the House Committee on Public	
7	Health, Welfare, and Labor, and the Director of the Department of Health a	
8	report on all requests received under § 17-80-503(1) that details:	
9	(1) Gaps in data that would assist with deliberations by the	
10	<pre>council;</pre>	
11	(2) Data that should be collected by healthcare professional	
12	licensing entities to address information gaps;	
13	(3) Available data sources that would provide meaningful	
14	information for deliberations by the council; and	
15	(4) The findings of the advisory groups.	
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17	17-80-507. Resources of healthcare professional licensing entities.	
18	The Director of the Department of Health may request healthcare	
19	professional licensing entities to provide resources necessary to implement	
20	the intent of this subchapter including without limitation:	
21	(1) Posting of notices on a website of the healthcare	
22	professional licensing entity;	
23	(2) Disseminating information to licensees;	
24	(3) Staffing for advisory groups as described in § 17-80-504;	
25	(4) Providing information as needed; and	
26	(5) Preparing reports.
