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28	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 6-81-1605(3), concerning eligibility
29	criteria established by the Department of Higher Education for applicants to
30	the State Teacher Education Program, is amended to read as follows:
31	(3) <u>(A)</u> Meet additional continuing eligibility criteria
32	established by the Department of Higher Education.
33	(B) An individual who has earned a teaching license upon
34	the successful completion of the an alternative educator preparation program
35	is an eligible student under this section.

1	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 6-81-1606(a), concerning the duration and
2	amount of loan repayments under the State Teacher Education Program, is
3	amended to read as follows:
4	(a) The State Teacher Education Program shall be used to provide a
5	loan repayment for federal student loans in the amount of:
6	(1) Three thousand dollars (\$3,000) per year for a maximum of
7	three (3) years for a licensed teacher who graduated from a teacher education
8	program after April 2004 and teaches in a public school in this state <u>or</u>
9	successfully completed an alternative educator preparation program after
10	April 2004 and teaches in a public school in this state program:
11	(A) In a subject area designated by the Department of Higher Education
12	in consultation with the Department of Education as having a critical
13	shortage of teachers; or
14	(B) Located in a geographical area of the state designated
15	by the Department of Higher Education in consultation with the Department of
16	Education as having a critical shortage of teachers; and
17	(2) An additional one thousand dollars (\$1,000) per year for a
18	maximum of three (3) years for a licensed teacher who is:
19	(A) Is a minority a <del>nd who graduated</del> ;
20	(B) Either:
21	(i) Graduated from a teacher education program after
22	April 2004 <u>; or</u>
23	(ii) Successfully completed an alternative educator
24	preparation program; and teaches
25	(C) Teaches in a public school in this state.
