7	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 23-99-1103, concerning the definitions		
8	under the Prior Authorization Transparency Act, is amended to add an		
9	additional subdivision to read as follows:		
10	(21) "Prescription for medication-assisted treatment" means any		
11	prescription for medication used as treatment for opioid addiction.		
12			
13	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code Title 23, Chapter 99, Subchapter 11, is		
14	amended to add an additional section to read as follows:		
15	23-99-1119. Medication-assisted treatment for opioid addiction.		
16	(a) A healthcare insurer, including Medicaid, shall not:		
17	(1) Require prior authorization in order for a patient to obtain		
18	coverage of buprenorphine, methadone, naloxone, naltrexone, Suboxone, or the		
19	various formulations of these drugs approved by the United States Food and		
20	Drug Administration for the treatment of opioid addiction; or		
21	(2) Impose any other requirement other than a valid prescription		
22	or compliance with the medication-assisted treatment guidelines issued by the		
23	<u>United States Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration in</u>		
24	order for a patient to obtain coverage of buprenorphine, methadone, naloxone,		
25	naltrexone, Suboxone, or the various formulations of these drugs approved by		
26	the United States Food and Drug Administration for the treatment of opioid		
27	addiction.		
28	(b) If a new formulation or medication for treatment of opioid		
29	addiction becomes available after the effective date of this section and is		
30	either more expensive or has not been shown to be more effective than the		
31	formulations and medications in subsection (a) of this section, then the		
32	healthcare insurer may require prior authorization of the new formulation or		
33	medication.		
34	(c) A charge for coverage of a prescription for medication-assisted		
35	treatment for opioid addiction, if applicable, shall be on the lowest-cost		
36	benefit tier of a prescription drug formulary.		

1	(d) For purposes of any limit a healthcare insurer imposes on the		
2	number of prescriptions for a patient, a prescription for medication-assisted		
3	treatment shall not be counted.		
4	(e) This section does not affect the responsibility of a healthcare		
5	provider to comply with the standard of care for medication-assisted		
6	treatment, including without limitation the use of therapy in combination		
7	with medication.		
8			
9	SECTION 4. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the		
10	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that medication-assisted treatment		
11	is effective at treating opioid addiction and results in substantial cost		
12	savings; that some healthcare insurers, including Medicaid, are placing		
13	numerous prior authorization requirements on healthcare providers and their		
14	patients who are in need of medication-assisted treatment; that these		
15	requirements are counterproductive; and that this act is immediately		
16	necessary because, as a result of these requirements, patients resort to		
17	continued illegal drug use to stop withdrawals and physicians may be deterred		
18	from treating patients due to the difficult prior authorization requirements.		
19	Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being immediately		
20	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall		
21	<u>become effective on:</u>		
22	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
23	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,		
24	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the		
25	<u>bill; or</u>		
26	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is		
27	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
