19	(A) Acquire and stock a supply of albuterol as authorized
20	by subdivision (g)(l) of this section; and
21	(B) Enter into agreements with manufacturers of albuterol
22	to obtain the albuterol free of charge or at fair market or reduced prices.
23	(3) A school district or public charter school shall designate
24	an employee trained in the possession and administration of albuterol to be
25	responsible for the storage, maintenance, and distribution of albuterol
26	stocked by the school.
