## For An Act To Be Entitled

9 AN ACT TO CREATE THE EGG PROVIDER PROTECTION ACT; AND  
10 FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

### Subtitle

14 TO CREATE THE EGG PROVIDER PROTECTION  
15 ACT.

18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
19

20 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 20, Chapter 16, is amended to add an  
21 additional subchapter to read as follows:

#### Subchapter 20 – Egg Provider Protection Act

##### 20-16-2001. Title.

25 This subchapter shall be known and may be cited as the "Egg Provider  
26 Protection Act".  
27

##### 20-16-2002. Definitions.

##### As used in this subchapter:

30 (1) "Egg" means the unfertilized gamete or oocyte of  
31 a female human being;

32 (2) "Egg harvesting" means the extraction of an egg from the  
33 reproductive organs of an egg provider for purposes other than the  
34 impregnation of the egg provider with those same eggs;

35 (3) "Egg provider" means any woman who provides or agrees to  
36 provide her eggs for purposes other than her own impregnation with those same



1 eggs;

2 (4) "Licensed physician" means any person licensed to practice  
3 medicine in this state, including a medical doctor and a doctor of  
4 osteopathy; and

5 (5) "Solicitation" means any advertisement, whether written,  
6 printed, or spoken, in a newspaper or magazine, on radio, television, or  
7 internet, or otherwise published.

9 20-16-2003. Professional and clinical requirements.

10 (a) A person shall not perform egg harvesting unless:

11 (1) He or she is a licensed physician; and

12 (2) The egg harvesting is performed in a hospital, clinic, or  
13 other medical facility that meets the licensing standards for such facilities  
14 in this state as determined by the Department of Health.

15 (b) A person or entity that provides compensation for eggs or egg  
16 harvesting shall:

17 (1) Compensate for:

18 (A) Any immediate health-related effect or injury; and

19 (B) Economic loss, including economic loss for missed days  
20 at work; and

21 (2) Provide a health insurance policy to cover against the  
22 development of potential health risks associated with the egg harvesting or  
23 egg donation process.

24 (c) Any gratuitous payment to the egg provider shall not exceed an  
25 amount typically paid to research subjects for their time and trouble in  
26 unrelated medical tests at the facility offering the reimbursement or, if  
27 other live-subject medical tests are not conducted at the facility, at other  
28 medical facilities in the state.

29

30 20-16-2004. Solicitation of egg providers.

31 (a) Solicitation of egg providers shall not include an offer for  
32 compensation, financial or otherwise, for eggs or egg harvesting.

33 (b) Any solicitation of an egg provider shall include a summary of any  
34 drug or hormone treatments involved in enabling an egg provider to provide  
35 eggs or in the process of egg harvesting, the total number of office or other  
36 visits that an egg provider will be required to make, and the intended use of

1 the eggs to be harvested.

2  
3 20-16-2005. Penalties.

4 (a) A person or entity that intentionally or knowingly violates this  
5 subchapter is guilty of a Class A misdemeanor.

6 (b) A person or entity that violates this subchapter shall also be  
7 civilly fined five hundred dollars (\$500), twice the amount of gross  
8 pecuniary gain derived from the violation, or, at the discretion of the  
9 court, any amount between five hundred dollars (\$500) and twice the amount of  
10 gross pecuniary gain derived from the violation.
