24	(a) The General Assembl	y finds that:	
25	(1) The steamboat	SS Sultana was launch	ed from Litherbury
26	Shipyard in Cincinnati, Ohio,	in February 1863 as on	e of the largest and best
27	business steamers ever constru	cted;	
28	(2) Its capacity	of three hundred seven	ty-six (376) passengers
29	and crewmembers attracted the	United States Army to	commandeer it for use as
30	a supply and soldier transport	vessel during the Civ	il War;
31	(3) The United St	ates Army chartered the	e Sultana at Vicksburg,
32	Mississippi, to transport over	two thousand three hu	ndred (2,300) passengers,
33	including over two thousand (2	,000) recently release	d Union prisoners of war
34	from the Andersonville and Cahaba prisons in the South back home to the		
35	North;		
36	(4) On April 26,	1865, the Sultana stop	ped at Helena, Arkansas,

- 1 the location at which photographer Thomas W. Bankes took the only photograph
- 2 <u>in existence of the grossly overcrowded vessel and its doomed passengers;</u>
- 3 (5)(A) At 2:00 a.m. on April 27, 1865, the Sultana's boiler
- 4 system erupted in a massive explosion just seven (7) miles north of Memphis,
- 5 Tennessee, causing a conflagration of fire and flying shrapnel and the
- 6 venting of deadly steam that resulted in over two thousand (2,000)
- 7 <u>casualties</u>, of which more than one thousand two hundred (1,200) died from the
- 8 explosion itself.
- 9 (B) Nearly seven hundred (700) more individuals were
- 10 dragged to safety over several hours and taken to five (5) Memphis hospitals,
- ll with many perishing later from injuries, burns, and exposure to the frigid
- 12 <u>Mississippi River floodwaters</u>;
- 13 <u>(6) Several Crittenden County, Arkansas, citizens were</u>
- 14 officially credited with saving dozens of lives that night by wading into the
- 15 <u>flooded Mississippi River to retrieve victims of the tragedy as they floated</u>
- 16 downriver;
- 17 (7) The event was made all the more tragic by evidence of greed,
- 18 corruption, malfeasance in office, and dereliction of officer duty, as noted
- by a following United States Army investigation into the disaster;
- 20 (8) The event occurred in the Mound City, Arkansas, and Marion,
- 21 Arkansas, areas of the Mississippi River, places where the remains of the
- 22 <u>Sultana and its lost souls still rest today and where Arkansas citizens were</u>
- 23 the saviors of many survivors that night;
- 24 (9) The United States House of Representatives passed a
- 25 resolution in 2009 acknowledging the explosion of the SS Sultana as the
- 26 greatest maritime disaster in United States history; and
- 27 (10) The lives and service of all the soldiers, passengers, and
- 28 local citizens involved in the tragedy are currently honored and recognized
- 29 with a temporary exhibit of Sultana artifacts in Marion, Arkansas, with plans
- 30 for a permanent Sultana Disaster Museum by 2020 in Marion, Arkansas.
- 31 <u>(b) April 27 each year shall be known as "Sultana Disaster Remembrance</u>
- 32 Day" to commemorate Arkansas's role in the greatest maritime disaster in
- 33 United States history.
- 34 (c) Sultana Disaster Remembrance Day is not a legal holiday but is a
- 35 memorial day to be commemorated by the issuance of an appropriate
- 36 proclamation by the Governor.
