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32	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code	Title 6, Chapter 82, is amended to add an
33	additional subchapter to read as	follows:
34	Subchapter 20 — Graduate Med	dical Education Residency Expansion Board
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36	6-82-2001. Graduate Medic	al Education Residency Expansion Board.

1	(a) There is established the Graduate Medical Education Residency
2	Expansion Board, which shall administer the program under this subchapter and
3	shall be composed of:
4	(1) One (1) representative from each medical school in Arkansas;
5	(2) Two (2) physician members appointed by the Arkansas State
6	Medical Board, giving preference to physicians who have received rural
7	medical practice loans, community match loans, or income incentives; and
8	(3) Two (2) representatives appointed by the Arkansas Hospital
9	Association, Inc.
10	(b) The board shall:
11	(1) Promulgate rules necessary to execute this subchapter,
12	including without limitation rules that address the requirements and are in
13	conformance with the requirements of the Arkansas Administrative Procedure
14	Act, § 25-15-201 et seq.;
15	(2) Prescribe forms for and regulate the submission of grant
16	applications;
17	(3) Determine the eligibility of applicants;
18	(4) Manage, operate, and control all funds and property
19	appropriated or otherwise contributed for this purpose;
20	(5) Accept gifts, grants, bequests, or devises and apply them as
21	a part of the program under this subchapter;
22	(6) Sue and be sued as the board; and
23	(7) Accept moneys from federal programs that may be used for
24	furtherance of the purposes of this subchapter.
25	(c) The members of the board may receive expense reimbursement and
26	stipends in accordance with § 25-16-901 et seq.
27	(d) The Department of Higher Education shall administer the Graduate
28	Medical Education Fund under § 19-5-1264 and disburse the funds at the
29	direction of the board under this subchapter.
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31	6-82-2002. Planning grants.
32	(a) As used in this subchapter, a "planning grant" is a grant awarded
33	by the Graduate Medical Education Residency Expansion Board to eligible
34	entities and individuals under this subchapter.
35	(b) The board shall:
36	(1) Allocate funds appropriated for purposes of this subchapter

1	(2) Award a one-time planning grant under this section to an
2	entity in this state that:
3	(A) Has never had a graduate medical education program;
4	and_
5	(B) Is eligible for Medicare funding of graduate medical
6	education;
7	(3) Award planning grants on a competitive basis according to
8	the criteria adopted by the board under its rules; and
9	(4) Determine the number of planning grants awarded and the
10	amount of each planning grant.
11	(c)(1) An application for a planning grant under this section shall be
12	submitted by an entity to the board no later than July 15 of the year
13	preceding the year for which the planning grant will be used.
14	(2) The board shall award a planning grant to an eligible entity
15	under this section no later than August 15 of the year in which the eligible
16	entity's application was submitted.
17	(d) An entity that is awarded a planning grant under this section and
18	establishes additional first-year residency positions after the receipt of a
19	planning grant is eligible for additional funds for each position
20	<u>established.</u>
21	
22	6-82-2003. Planning grants for program expansion or new programs.
23	(a) The Graduate Medical Education Residency Expansion Board shall
24	award planning grants to enable entities with existing graduate medical
25	education programs to:
26	(1) Increase the number of first-year residency positions; and
27	(2) Provide for the establishment of new graduate medical
28	education programs with first-year residency positions.
29	(b) The board shall determine the number of planning grants awarded
30	under this section and the amount of each planning grant awarded under this
31	section.
32	(c) A planning grant under this section shall be used to support the
33	direct resident costs to the graduate medical education program, including
34	without limitation stipends and benefits.
35	(d) An entity applying for a planning grant under this section shall:
36	(1) Include a plan for receiving accreditation for the increased

1	number of residency positions or for the new graduate medical education
2	program, as applicable; and
3	(2) Be submitted to the board no later than October 1 preceding
4	the academic year for which the planning grant is made.
5	(e) The board shall:
6	(1) Award a planning grant under this section no later than
7	January 1 of the year in which the planning grant will be used; and
8	(2) Distribute a planning grant amount for a residency position
9	under this section only upon receiving verification that the applicable
10	residency position has been filled.
11	(f)(1) A planning grant awarded under this section shall be in effect
12	for no more than three (3) consecutive fiscal years.
13	(2) For each first-year residency position for which an entity
14	with a graduate medical education program receives an initial planning grant
15	under this section, the board shall award the entity with the graduate
16	medical education program an equal planning grant amount for the following
17	fiscal year, not to exceed three (3) fiscal years.
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19	6-82-2004. Priority of planning grants — Adjustment of amounts.
20	(a) If the Graduate Medical Education Residency Expansion Board
21	determines that the number of first-year residency positions proposed by
22	eligible applicants under § 6-82-2003 exceeds the amount of funding
23	appropriated for the planning grants under this subchapter, the board:
24	(1) May give priority for up to fifty percent (50%) of the
25	funded first-year residency positions to be in primary care or other critical
26	shortage areas in this state; and
27	(2) Shall not reduce planning grant amounts awarded for each
28	resident position, but may proportionately reduce the number of positions
29	funded for each graduate medical education program.
30	(b) If the board determines that, based on the applications it has
31	received for planning grants under § 6-82-2003, the entire appropriation for
32	planning grants under this subchapter shall not be awarded for a particular
33	year, the board may transfer and use the funds appropriated to award planning
34	grants under § 6-82-2002.
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6-82-2005. Planning grants for additional years of residency.

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1	(a) If the Graduate Medical Education Residency Expansion Board
2	determines that funds appropriated under this subchapter are available after
3	all eligible planning grant applications under §§ 6-82-2002 and 6-82-2003
4	have been funded, the board shall award planning grants from excess funds to
5	support medical residents who:
6	(1) Have completed at least three (3) years of residency; and
7	(2) Are enrolled in a residency program in a field in which this
8	state has less than eighty percent (80%) of the national average of
9	physicians per one hundred thousand (100,000) people, as determined by the
10	board.
11	(b) The board shall determine the following with respect to planning
12	grants under this section:
13	(1) The amount of a planning grant awarded under this section;
14	(2) The number of planning grants awarded under this section;
15	<u>and</u>
16	(3) The residency fields in which recipients of planning grants
17	under this section work.
18	(c) A planning grant under this section shall be used to support the
19	direct resident costs to the graduate medical education program, including
20	without limitation stipends and benefits.
21	(d) The board shall distribute a planning grant amount for a residency
22	position under this section only upon receiving verification that the
23	applicable residency position has been filled.
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25	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code Title 19, Chapter 5, Subchapter 12, is
26	amended to add an additional section to read as follows:
27	19-5-1264. Graduate Medical Education Fund.
28	(a) There is created on the books of the Treasurer of State, the
29	Auditor of State, and the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State a miscellaneous
30	fund to be known as the "Graduate Medical Education Fund".
31	(b) The fund shall consist of:
32	(1) Gifts, grants, and donations,
33	(2) Any revenues provided by law; and
34	(3) Any other funds and fund transfers authorized or provided
35	for by law.
36	(c)(1) The fund shall be administered by the Department of Higher

1	Education as provided in § 6-82-2001 et seq., and as provided by any other
2	relevant provisions of law.
3	(2) The moneys in the fund shall be disbursed at the direction of
4	the Graduate Medical Education Residency Expansion Board as provided under §
5	<u>6-82-2001 et seq.</u>
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
