24	(A) Is licensed under § 3-5-1601 et seq.; and			
25	(B) Produced by fermentation at least eight hundred			
26	gallons (800 gals.) of wine in the previous calendar year, as reported on the			
27	winery's TTB F 5120-17 Report of Wine Premises Operations; "Person" means an			
28	individual, partnership, limited liability company, limited liability			
29	partnership, corporation, firm, company, or other entity doing business in			
30	Arkansas; and			
31	(2) "Vinous liquor" means the fermented juices of fruits			
32	containing more than five percent (5%) and not more than twenty-one percent			
33	(21%) of alcohol by weight <del>; and</del>			
34	(3) "Winery" means an establishment that makes vinous liquor.

- 24 (1) Providing the division with a copy of the licenses required under 25 subdivision (b)(2) of this section; and

  27 of a wine direct shipper permit shall allow the division to perform an audit
  28 of the wine direct shipper permit holder's records regarding the shipment of
  29 wine into the state upon request.

  31 of the state, the holder of the wine direct shipper permit is required to
  32 report annually to the division the total amount of wine shipped into the

15	3-5-1711. Administration and penalties.
16	(a)(1) The Alcoholic Beverage Control Division may enforce the
17	requirements of this subchapter by administrative proceedings to suspend or
18	revoke a wine direct shipper permit.
19	(2) The division may accept payment of an offer in compromise in
20	lieu of suspension of the wine direct shipper permit holder's permit as
21	determined by a rule promulgated by the division.
22	(b) A person that does not hold a wine direct shipper permit shall not
23	ship wine directly to consumers.
24	(c) A person that knowingly makes, participates in, transports,
25	imports, or receives a shipment from a person without a wine direct shipper
26	permit upon conviction may be subject to the following:
27	(1) An administrative penalty as established by the division for
28	a first offense;
29	(2) A Class C misdemeanor for a second offense; and
30	(3) A Class D felony for a third and subsequent offense.
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
