26	(a) <u>(l)</u> A person co	mmits the offense of disorderly co	onduct if, with the

15	(b)(1) A person commits the offense of aggravated disorderly conduct		
16	if, with the purpose to cause public inconvenience, annoyance, or alarm, or		
17	recklessly creating a risk of public inconvenience, annoyance, or alarm, he		
18	or she in congregation with one (1) or more other persons obstructs access to		
19	the pursuit of lawful work or employment, including without limitation:		
20	(A) The obstruction of the entrance to or exit from a		
21	<pre>place of employment;</pre>		
22	(B) The obstruction of free use of public roads, streets,		
23	highways, railways, airports, or other rights-of-way of travel or conveyance;		
24	(C) The obstruction of the entrance to or exit from a

1	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code Title 16, Chapter 118, is amended to add an
2	additional section to read as follows:
3	16-118-116. Civil action regarding violations of § 5-71-207(b).
4	(a) A person or entity who is harmed by an act of aggravated
5	disorderly conduct, § 5-71-207(b), may seek injunctive relief in the circuit
6	court having jurisdiction to enjoin a person engaged in aggravated disorderly
7	conduct.
8	(b) A court hearing a petition for injunctive relief under this
9	section may award court costs and reasonable attorney's fees to a prevailing
10	party as well as order a civil fine of up to one thousand dollars (\$1,000)
11	per day for a person who violates an order enjoining him or her from engaging
12	in aggravated disorderly conduct.
