29	WHEREAS, 15 U.S.	C. § 260a, as it ext	isted on December 20, 2018, provides	
30	for the advancement of time known as daylight saving time, during the period			
31	set by federal law for	the advancement of	time each calendar year; and

33	WHEREAS, alterna	ting between Central	l Daylight Time, also known as	
34	"daylight saving time", and Central Standard Time is inconvenient and does			
35	not benefit the people	of Arkansas; and

1	WHEREAS, the exemption from daylight saving time available to Arkansas			
2	under 15 U.S.C. § 260a, is equally inconvenient and lacking benefit as the			
3	result of adopting the exemption is to never "spring forward", which would			
4	unfortunately dictate more dark hours during the normal awake times of			
5	citizens; and

7	WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of Arkansas that the time for the			
8	Central Time Zone as observed by Arkansas be advanced by one (1) hour ahead			
9	of Central Standard Time, or "spring forward", and remain at that time			
10	permanently,

12	NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-			
13	SECOND GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

15	THAT, if the states that border Arkansas express similar interests, the			
16	House of Representatives of the Ninety-Second General Assembly of the State			
17	of Arkansas call upon the United States Government to amend 15 U.S.C. § 260a			
18	to allow:			
19	(1) The State of Arkansas to choose the time that best suits			
20	Arkansas's interests; and			
21	(2) Arkansas and all other states with similar interests to			
22	advance the time for each state's specified time zone by one (1) hour ahead
