16	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code §§ 17-26-306 and 17-26-307 are repealed.
17	17-26-306. Electrologists - Prerequisites to examination.
18	The Department of Health shall admit to examination for a license as an
19	electrologist a person who has made application to the department in proper
20	form, has paid the fee required, and who:
21	(1) Is not less than eighteen (18) years of age;
22	(2) Has completed the twelfth grade or an accredited senior high
23	school in the public schools of this state or its equivalent; and
24	(3) Has completed one (1) of the following:
25	$(\Lambda)$ A course of three hundred fifty (350) hours of
26	practical training as a student in conjunction with a course of one thousand
27	five hundred (1,500) hours in cosmetology or for a licensed cosmetologist;
28	(B) A course of six hundred (600) hours of practical
29	training as a student, when not in conjunction with a regular course in
30	cosmetology or for a licensed cosmetologist, extending over a period of not
31	less than four (4) months under the immediate supervision of a licensed
32	electrologist instructor in a school of cosmetology;
33	(C) The prescribed course of study in electrology under
34	the laws of another state whose licensing requirements are equal to or
35	stricter than those in Arkansas; or
36	(D) Training and practice in electrology for a period as

1	shall be specified by rules of the State Board of Health.

3	17-26-307. Electrology instructors - Prerequisites to examination.
4	The Department of Health shall admit to examination for license as an
5	electrology instructor any person who has made application to the department
6	in proper form, has paid the fee required, and who:
7	(1) Is not less than twenty-one (21) years of age;
8	(2) Holds a valid Arkansas license as an electrologist; and
9	(3) Has had three (3) years of practical experience as an
10	electrologist in the State of Arkansas within the past five (5) years.
11	
12	SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 17-26-315 is amended to read as follows:
13	17-26-315. Reciprocity.
14	Upon application to the Department of Health in the form provided for
15	the particular class of license applied for, accompanied by the required fee,
16	a person licensed as a cosmetologist, electrologist, manicurist,
17	aesthetician, or instructor under the laws of another state shall be granted
18	a license to practice the occupation or occupations in this state not of
19	greater scope than the occupation or occupations for which the applicant was
20	previously licensed in the other state, upon the following conditions:
21	(1) That the applicant for a license as a cosmetologist,
22	manicurist, or aesthetician is $\frac{1}{1}$ not $\frac{1}{1}$ eighteen (18) years of age $\frac{1}{1}$
23	older, and the applicant for a license as an instructor or electrologist is
24	not less than twenty-one (21) years of age or older;
25	(2) That the applicant holds a current valid license upon
26	application for reciprocity, evidenced by a certified copy of the license and
27	an affidavit from the other state or by such other evidence as the department
28	may require;
29	(3) That the applicant has passed an examination comparable to
30	the examination given in this state; and
31	(4) That the applicant passes an Arkansas law examination under
32	this chapter.
33	
34	SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 17-26-317(a)(1), concerning notice of
35	address change for cosmetology and related occupational licensing, is amended
36	to read as follows:

4	hundred fifty (150) hours of instruction, may engage, in the school as a		
5	student, in work connected with any branch or any combination of the branche		
6	of cosmetology taught in the school upon a client who is paying for service		
7	or materials;		
8	(2) A student for a license as a manicurist, after sixty (60)		
9	hours of instruction, may engage, in the school as a student, in work		
10	connected with manicuring taught in the school upon a client who is paying		
11	for service or materials; and		
12	(3) A student for a license as an aesthetician, after sixty (60		
13	hours of instruction, may engage, in the school as a student, in work		
14	connected with aesthetics taught in the school upon a client who is paying		
15	for service or materials <del>; and</del>		
16	(4) A student for a license as an electrologist, after sixty		
17	(60) hours of instruction, may engage, in the school as a student, in work		
18	connected with electrology taught in the school upon a client who is paying		
19	for service or materials.
