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17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:	
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19	SECTION 1. DO NOT CODIFY. <u>Legislative findings and intent.</u>	
20	(a) The General Assembly finds that:	
21	(1) Arkansas is taking a leading role in the nationwide	<u>pursuit</u>
22	of reforms to the system of occupational licensing;	
23	(2) Arkansas became one (1) of eleven (11) states chosen	<u>to</u>
24	participate in the Occupational Licensing Policy Learning Consortium,	<u>an</u>
25	initiative funded by a grant from the United States Department of Lab	or and
26	supported in partnership with the National Conference of State Legisl	atures,
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28	(3) Governor Asa Hutchinson appointed seventeen (17) ind	<u>ividuals</u>
29	to the Red Tape Reduction Working Group to review and address occupat	<u>ional</u>
30	licensing regulations that create unnecessary barriers to labor marke	t entry;
31	(4) The Red Tape Reduction Working Group issued a final	<u>report</u>
32	to the Governor in the fall of 2018 with five (5) recommendations for	
33	substantive legislative reform, which are to:	
34	(A) Establish an expedited procedure for occupation	<u>nal</u>
35	licensing entities to collectively submit administrative rules that a	<u>re</u>
36	responsive to new legislation;	

1	(B) Extend Acts 2017, No. 781, to allow repeal of
2	subsections of rules;
3	(C) Establish provisions to allow certain agencies to
4	consider occupational relevance with regard to criminal background issues;
5	(D) Authorize occupational licensing entities to identify
6	types of individuals or entities that may be issued temporary or provisional
7	licenses; and
8	(E) Establish a systematic process for review of:
9	(i) New occupational licensure and occupational
10	licensing entities; and
11	(ii) Existing occupational licensure and
12	occupational licensing entities;
13	(5) Several occupational licenses are needlessly regulated and
14	could be deregulated or de-licensed without causing detrimental harm to the
15	citizens of the State of Arkansas and the economy of the this state; and
16	(6) Research has found that occupational licensing reduces
17	access to jobs, inhibits geographic mobility, and raises the costs of
18	services.
19	(b) It is the intent of the General Assembly to deregulate or de-
20	license the occupation or profession of psychiatric technician nurses.
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22	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 6-51-701(f), concerning the establishment
23	of the Associate of Applied Science Degree in Nursing Program, is amended to
24	read as follows:
25	(f)(1) The program of instruction as authorized in this subchapter may
26	be offered to licensed practical nurses <del>or licensed psychiatric technician</del>
27	nurses duly licensed by the Arkansas State Board of Nursing.
28	(2) For admittance to the nursing program, the nurse $\frac{\text{must}}{\text{shall}}$
29	have:
30	(A) A minimum of two thousand $(2,000)$ total hours of
31	documented work and occupational experience in a <del>health care</del> <u>healthcare</u>
32	institution; and
33	(B) Documentation from an official of a health care
34	healthcare institution that the candidate has been an employee for the
35	required length of time.
36	(3) For purposes of this subsection, a "health care healthcare

- institution" means a hospital, a long-term care facility, a medical doctor's office or clinic, an outpatient clinic, a residential care facility, any of
- 3 several state agencies, or employment as a public health, industrial, or
- 4 school nurse.

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- 6 SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 6-51-702 is amended to read as follows: 7 6-51-702. Nature of program.
- 8 (a) The licensed practical nurse or licensed psychiatric technician
  9 nurse to registered nurse program is an upward-mobility program for licensed
  10 practical nurses or licensed psychiatric technician nurses who have completed
  11 one (1) calendar year, or two thousand (2,000) hours minimum, of work in a
  12 health care healthcare institution.
- 13 <u>(b)</u> The program of study will lead to the Associate of Applied Science 14 Degree in Nursing.

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- SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 17-87-101 is amended to read as follows: 17 17-87-101. License required — Purpose.
  - (a) In order to safeguard life and health, a person practicing or offering to practice nursing for compensation shall be required to submit evidence that he or she is qualified to so practice and shall be licensed to practice as provided in this chapter:
    - (1) Professional nursing;
  - (2) Advanced practice registered nursing;
- 24 (3) Registered practitioner nursing; or
- 25 (4) Practical nursing; or
- 26 (5) Psychiatric technician nursing.
- 27 (b) It is unlawful for any person not licensed by the Arkansas State 28 Board of Nursing:
- 29 (1) To practice or offer to practice professional nursing,
  30 advanced practice registered nursing, registered practitioner nursing, or
  31 practical nursing, or psychiatric technician nursing; or
- 32 (2) To use any sign, card, or device to indicate that the person 33 is a professional registered nurse, an advanced practice registered nurse, a 34 registered nurse practitioner, or a licensed practical nurse, or a licensed 35 psychiatric technician nurse.

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           SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 17-87-102(11), concerning the definition of
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     "practice of psychiatric technician nursing", is repealed.
                 (11) "Practice of psychiatric technician nursing" means the
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     performance for compensation of nursing practices by a licensed psychiatric
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     technician nurse that are relevant to the care of the physically and mentally
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     impaired, injured, or infirm or the delegation of certain nursing practices
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     to other personnel as set forth in regulations established by the board, and
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     the carrying out of medical orders under the direction of a professional
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     registered nurse, an advanced practice registered nurse, a licensed
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     physician, or a licensed dentist, when such activities do not require the
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     substantial specialized skill, judgment, and knowledge required in
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     professional nursing; and
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           SECTION 6. Arkansas Code § 17-87-104(a)(1), concerning penalties
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     regarding nursing, is amended to read as follows:
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           (a)(1) It shall be is a misdemeanor for any person to:
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                       (A) Sell or fraudulently obtain or furnish any nursing
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     diploma, license, renewal, or record, or aid or abet therein;
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                       (B) Practice nursing as defined by this chapter under
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     cover of any diploma, license, or record illegally or fraudulently obtained
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     or signed or issued unlawfully or under fraudulent representation;
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                       (C) Practice professional nursing, advanced practice
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     nursing, registered nurse practitioner nursing, or practical nursing, or
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     psychiatric technician nursing as defined by this chapter unless licensed by
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     the Arkansas State Board of Nursing to do so;
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                       (D) Use in connection with his or her name any of the
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     following titles, names, or initials, if the user is not properly licensed
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     under this chapter:

16	(F) Conduct a nursing education program for the
17	preparation of professional nurses, advanced practice registered nurses,
18	nurse practitioners, <u>or</u> practical nurses <del>, or psychiatric technician nurses</del>
19	unless the program has been approved by the board;
20	(G) Prescribe any drug or medicine as authorized by this
21	chapter unless certified by the board as having prescriptive authority,
22	except that a certified registered nurse anesthetist shall not be is not
23	required to have prescriptive authority to provide anesthesia care, including
24	the administration of drugs or medicines necessary for the care; or
25	(H) Otherwise violate any provisions of this chapter.
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27	SECTION 7. Arkansas Code § 17-87-201(d), concerning the creation of
28	the Arkansas State Board of Nursing, is amended to read as follows:
29	(d)(1) Three (3) members shall be are required to be licensed
30	practical nurses <del>or licensed psychiatric technician nurses</del> .
31	(2) Each licensed practical nurse board member or licensed
32	psychiatric technician nurse board member shall have the following
33	qualifications is required to:
34	(A) Be an Arkansas resident;
35	(B) Have at least five (5) years of successful experience

2	(C) Be licensed in Arkansas as a licensed practical nurse

12	educational programs preparing persons for licensure as registered nurses,
13	advanced practice registered nurses, registered nurse practitioner nurses,
14	and licensed practical nurses, and licensed psychiatric technician nurses;
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16	SECTION 9. Arkansas Code § 17-87-203(14), concerning the powers and
17	duties of the Arkansas State Board of Nursing, is amended to read as follows:
18	(14) Examine, license, and renew the licenses of qualified
19	applicants for professional nursing, and practical nursing, and psychiatric
20	technician nursing;
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22	SECTION 10. Arkansas Code § 17-87-305 is repealed.
23	17-87-305. Licensed psychiatric technician nurses.
24	(a) Qualifications. An applicant for a license to practice
25	psychiatric technician nursing shall submit to the Arkansas State Board of
26	Nursing evidence, verified by oath, that the applicant:
27	(1) Is of good moral character;
28	(2) Has completed an approved high school course of study or the
29	equivalent thereof as determined by the appropriate educational agency; and
30	(3) Has completed a prescribed curriculum in a state-approved
31	program for the preparation of psychiatric technician nurses and holds a
32	diploma or certificate therefrom. However, the board may waive this
33	requirement if the board determines the applicant to be otherwise qualified.
34	(b) Issuance of License. A license to practice as a psychiatric
35	technician nurse may be issued:
36	(1) By Evamination. The applicant shall be required to pass a

- 1 written examination in such subjects as the board may determine. Each written 2 examination may be supplemented by an oral examination. Upon successfully 3 passing the examination, the board shall issue to the applicant a license to 4 practice as a psychiatric technician nurse. All such examinations shall be 5 conducted by an examiner, who shall be a registered nurse, and by an 6 assistant examiner, who shall be a licensed psychiatric technician nurse; or 7 (2) By Endorsement. The board may issue a license to practice 8 psychiatric technician nursing by endorsement to an applicant who has duly 9 been licensed or registered as a licensed psychiatric technician nurse or a 10 person entitled to perform similar services under a different title under the 11 laws of another state, territory, or foreign country if, in the opinion of 12 the board, the applicant meets the requirements for licensed psychiatric 13 technician nurses in this state at the time of graduation and if the board so 14 recommends. 15 (c) Person Licensed Before to March 29, 1971. Any person holding a 16 license to practice as a psychiatric technician issued by the board in 17 accordance with Acts 1953, No. 124 [repealed], and which was valid on March 18 29, 1971, shall be deemed to be licensed as a psychiatric technician nurse 19 under the provisions of this chapter. (d) Title and Abbreviation. Any person who holds a license to 20 21 practice psychiatric technician nursing in this state shall have the right to 22 use the title "licensed psychiatric technician nurse" and the abbreviation "L.P.T.N." 23 24 25 SECTION 11. Arkansas Code § 17-87-307(a) and (b), concerning temporary permits regarding the practice of nursing, are amended to read as follows: 26 27 (a)(1) Upon application and payment of the required fee, the Arkansas 28 State Board of Nursing may issue a temporary permit to practice professional.
- 30 has: 31 (A) Completed a program in professional, or practical, or

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32 psychiatric technician nursing approved by the appropriate state or national 33 authorizing agency of this state or country and by the appropriate

or practical, or psychiatric technician nursing to a qualified applicant who

- 34 authorizing agency of other states or territories or foreign countries; and
- 35 (B) Applied for or is awaiting results of the first 36 examination he or she is eligible to take after the permit is issued.

- (b)(1) Upon application and payment of the required fee, the board shall issue a temporary permit to a qualified applicant holding a current professional, or practical, or psychiatric technician license from another jurisdiction from any other state or territory awaiting endorsement.
- 8 (2) This permit  $\frac{\text{shall}}{\text{must}}$  have an issuance date and an expiration date. The permit shall be valid for no more than six (6) months.

SECTION 12. Arkansas Code § 17-87-401(a) and (b), concerning nursing education programs, are amended to read as follows:

- (a) An institution desiring to conduct a nursing education program to prepare professional, advanced practice, nurse practitioner, <u>and</u> practical, and psychiatric technician nurses shall apply to the Arkansas State Board of Nursing and submit evidence that:
- (1) It is prepared to carry out a program in professional nursing education, advanced practice nursing education, nurse practitioner nursing education, or practical nursing education, or psychiatric technician nursing training, as the case may be; and
  - (2) It is prepared to meet such standards as shall be established by this chapter and by the board.
  - (b)(1) A survey of the institution and its entire nursing education program shall be made by an authorized representative of the board, who shall submit a written report of the survey to the board.
  - (2) If, in the opinion of the board, the requirements for an approved nursing education program are met, the program shall be approved as a nursing education program for professional, advanced practice, nurse practitioner, and practical, and psychiatric technician nurses.
