2	(C) Counseling an individual or an individual's family to
3	promote informed choices and adaption to the risk or condition;
4	(D) Estimating the likelihood of occurrence or recurrence
5	of any potentially inherited or genetically influenced condition which may
6	involve:
7	(i) Obtaining and analyzing a complete health
8	history of the individual and the individual's family;
9	(ii) Reviewing the pertinent medical records;
10	(iii) Evaluating the risks from exposure to possible
11	mutagens or teratogens; and
12	(iv) Recommending genetic testing or other
13	evaluations to assist in the diagnosis of a condition or determine the
14	carrier status of one (1) or more family members;
15	(E) Assisting the individual, the individual's family, the
16	individual's healthcare provider, or the public to:
17	(i) Appreciate the medical, psychological, and
18	social implications of a disorder, including the features, variability, usual
19	course, and management options of the disorder;
20	(ii) Learn how genetic factors contribute to the
21	disorder and affect the chance for recurrence of the condition in other
22	family members;
23	(iii) Understand available options for coping with,
24	preventing, or reducing the chance of occurrence or recurrence of $a$
25	<pre>condition;</pre>
26	(iv) Select the most appropriate, accurate, and
27	cost-effective methods of diagnosis; and
28	(v) Understand genetic tests, including without
29	limitation diagnostic genetic tests, screening tests, or predispositional
30	genetic tests, coordinate testing for inherited disorders, and interpret
31	complex genetic test results; and
32	(F) Facilitating an individual's or an individual's
33	<pre>family's:</pre>
34	(i) Exploration of the perception of risk and burden
35	associated with a genetic disorder;
36	(ii) Decision-making regarding testing or medical

T	interventions consistent with their beliefs, goals, needs, resources,
2	culture, and ethical or moral views; and
3	(iii) Adjustment and adaption to the condition or
4	their genetic risk by addressing needs for psychological, social, and medical
5	support;
6	(2) "Licensed genetic counselor" means a person who is licensed
7	under this subchapter to engage in the practice of genetic counseling; and
8	(3)(A) "Supervision" means the ongoing, direct clinical review
9	for the purposes of training or teaching, by an approved supervisor who
10	monitors the performance or a person's supervised interaction with a client
11	and provides regular documented face-to-face consultation, guidance, and
12	instructions with respect to the clinical skills and competencies of the
13	person supervised.
14	(B) "Supervision" may include without limitation the
15	review of case presentation, audio tapes, video tapes, and direct
16	observation.
17	
18	17-95-1103. Exemptions from genetic counselor licensure.
19	This subchapter does not require licensure as a genetic counselor of:
20	(1) An individual who is licensed by this state as a healthcare
21	professional and who is practicing within his or her scope of practice,
22	including without limitation a physician or an advanced practice registered
23	nurse;
24	(2) An individual trained as a genetic counselor who is:
25	(A) Reapplying for the American Board of Genetic
26	Counseling certification examination and gathering logbook cases under
27	supervision in an approved genetic counseling training site; or
28	(B) Practicing under direct supervision of a licensed
29	physician;
30	(3) A student enrolled in an approved academic program in
31	genetic counseling if the practice constitutes a part of a supervised course
32	of study and the student is designated by a title that clearly indicates the
33	student's status as a student or trainee;
34	(4)(A) An individual who is employed by a state genetics center
35	to provide education regarding single gene conditions, including without
36	limitation sickle cell, cystic fibrosis, and hemoglobinopathies.

1	(B) An individual described in subdivision (4)(A) of this
2	section shall not use the title "genetic counselor" or any other title
3	tending to indicate that he or she is a genetic counselor unless he or she is
4	licensed in this state; and
5	(5)(A) A visiting genetic counselor who is certified by the
6	American Board of Genetic Counseling or American Board of Medical Genetics
7	from outside the state performing activities and services for a period of
8	thirty (30) days each year.
9	(B) A visiting genetic counselor shall be licensed if the
10	license is available in his or her home state.
11	
12	17-95-1104. Authority of the Arkansas State Medical Board.
13	The Arkansas State Medical Board shall:
14	(1) Develop appropriate rules necessary to regulate genetic
15	<pre>counselors;</pre>
16	(2) Receive, review, and approve applications for genetic
17	<pre>counselor licensure;</pre>
18	(3) Issue, renew, suspend, revoke, or deny licensure as a
19	genetic counselor;
20	(4) Conduct hearings on investigative and disciplinary
21	<pre>proceedings;</pre>
22	(5)(A) Maintain a database of all licensees and all persons
23	whose licenses have been suspended, revoked, or denied.
24	(B) Access to a database under subdivision (5)(A) of this
25	section shall be available upon written request and payment of an appropriate
26	fee as determined by the board; and
27	(6) Perform other functions and duties required to carry out
28	this subchapter.
29	
30	17-95-1105. Title protection.
31	A person shall not use or assume the title "licensed genetic counselor"
32	or "genetic counselor" or use any words, letters, abbreviations, or insignia
33	indicating or implying that the person holds a genetic counselor license
34	unless the person is licensed by the Arkansas State Medical Board.
35	
36	17-95-1106. Genetic counselor licensure.

I	(a) The Arkansas State Medical Board shall license as a licensed
2	genetic counselor an applicant who:
3	(1) Submits an application approved by the Arkansas State
4	Medical Board;
5	(2) Pays an application fee approved by the Arkansas State
6	Medical Board that is comparable to other fees for licensure of other
7	midlevel healthcare professionals licensed by the Arkansas State Medical
8	Board; and
9	(3) Provides evidence of:
10	(A) Having earned a master's degree from a genetic
11	counseling training program that is accredited by the American Board of
12	Genetic Counseling or an equivalent as determined by the American Board of
13	Genetic Counseling or the American Board of Medical Genetics; and
14	(B) Meets the examination requirements for certification
15	and has current certification as a genetic counselor by the American Board of
16	Genetic Counseling or the American Board of Medical Genetics.
17	(b)(l) The Arkansas State Medical Board may issue a license to an
18	applicant who provides evidence that he or she is licensed to practice as a
19	genetic counselor in another state or territory if the requirements for
20	licensure in the other state or territory are equal to the requirements in
21	this subchapter.
22	(2) The issuance of a license by reciprocity shall be at the
23	sole discretion of the Arkansas State Medical Board.
24	
25	17-95-1107. Renewal of genetic counselor license.
26	(a) Except in the case of a temporary license under § 17-95-1108, a
27	license shall be valid for a two-year period from the date of issuance.
28	(b) Upon receipt of a renewal application and renewal fees as
29	determined by the Arkansas State Medical Board, the board shall renew a
30	license to practice as a licensed genetic counselor.
31	(c)(l) As a condition of licensure renewal, a licensed genetic
32	counselor shall submit documentation that he or she has completed fifty (50)
33	hours of continuing education units approved by the board.
34	(2) The licensed genetic counselor is responsible for
35	maintaining:
36	(A) Competent records of having completed qualified

1	professional education for a period of four (4) years after close of the two-
2	year period to which the records pertain; and
3	(B) Information with respect to having completed a
4	qualified professional education to demonstrate that the education meet the
5	requirements of this subchapter.
6	(3) The Arkansas State Medical Board may waive the continuing
7	education requirement or grant an extension of time to complete the
8	continuing education requirement in cases of retirement, illness, disability,
9	or other undue hardship.
10	
11	17-95-1108. Temporary licensure.
12	(a)(1) The Arkansas State Medical Board may issue a temporary license
13	to an applicant who does not meet the certification requirement in § 17-95-
14	1106 if the applicant:
15	(A) Has been granted an active-candidate status by the
16	American Board of Genetic Counseling;
17	(B) Applies for and takes the certification examination
18	within twelve (12) months of the issuance of a temporary license; and
19	(C) Submits an application and appropriate application
20	fees with the Arkansas State Medical Board.
21	(2) A temporary license is valid for one (1) year from the date
22	of issuance.
23	(3)(A) A temporary license may be renewed for one (1) year if
24	the applicant fails on his or her first attempt to pass the certification
25	examination of the American Board of Genetic Counseling or the American Board
26	of Medical Genetics and Genomics.
27	(B) An application for renewal shall be signed by a
28	supervisor of the applicant.
29	(4) A temporary license shall expire automatically upon the
30	earliest of:
31	(A) The date of issuance of a license under § 17-95-1106;
32	(B) Ninety (90) days after the date that the applicant
33	fails on his or her second attempt to pass the certification examination; or
34	(C) The date printed on the temporary license.
35	(b) As a condition of temporary licensure, an applicant shall work
36	under the supervision of a licensed genetic counselor or a licensed physician

1	with current American Board of Genetic Counseling certification in clinical
2	genetics when the applicant provides genetic counseling services.
3	(c) A temporary license shall not be issued if the applicant has
4	failed the American Board of Genetic Counseling certification examination
5	more than two (2) times.
6	
7	17-95-1109. Denial, suspension, revocation, or refusal to renew -
8	Censure.
9	(a) The Arkansas State Medical Board may deny, suspend, revoke, or
10	refuse to renew a license, or may reprimand, censure, place on probation, or
11	otherwise discipline a licensee, upon proof that the licensee has:
12	(1) Obtained or attempted to obtain a license by fraud or
13	deception;
14	(2) Been convicted of a felony under state or federal law;
15	(3) Been adjudicated mentally ill or incompetent by a court;
16	(4) Used illicit drugs or intoxicating liquors, narcotics,
17	controlled substances, or other drugs or stimulants to an extent that
18	adversely affects the practice of genetic counseling;
19	(5) Engaged in unethical or unprofessional conduct, including
20	without limitation willful acts, negligence, or incompetence in the course of
21	professional practice;
22	(6) Violated any provision of this subchapter or any rule of the
23	board; or
24	(7) Been denied licensure or disciplined in another state or
25	territory in connection with a license in another state or territory.
26	(b) A licensee under subsection (a) of this section shall promptly
27	deliver his or her license to the board if the licensee:
28	(1) Has his or her license suspended or revoked; or
29	(2) Surrenders his or her license with or without prejudice if
30	the surrender is approved by the board.
31	(c) The board may restore a license or remove a probation on a license
32	based on the decision of the board.
33	
34	17-95-1110. Surrendering license due to retirement.
35	(a) In order to retire his or her license, a licensed genetic
36	counselor shall file an affidavit with the Arkansas State Medical Board

1 stating the date on which the individual will retire or has retired and other

2	information determined necessary by the board.
3	(b) If a licensed genetic counselor retires his or her licensed as
4	described in subsection (a) of this section, the individual shall apply for
5	licensure as provided in § 17-95-1106 and is not liable for renewal fees that
6	may accrue during the retirement period.
