14	12-12-1902. Commercial mobile radio service or internet service		
15	provider to provide information upon request.		
16	(a) Upon request of a law enforcement agency, a commercial mobile		
17	radio service provider shall provide location information of a wireless		
18	telecommunications device and an internet service provider shall provide		
19	geolocation information of an internet protocol (IP) address to the law		
20	enforcement agency in order <del>to</del> <u>that the law enforcement agency may</u> respond to		
21	a call for emergency services or $\frac{in}{i}$ to an emergency situation that involves		
22	the risk of death or serious physical harm.		
23	(b) This section does not prohibit a commercial mobile radio service		
24	provider or internet service provider from establishing protocols by which		
25	the commercial mobile radio service provider <u>or internet service provider</u> may		
26	voluntarily disclose location information or geolocation information.

28	12-12-1903. Limitation of liability.		
29	Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a commercial mobile radio		
30	service provider or an internet service provider, or its the officers,		
31	employees, assigns, or agents of a commercial mobile radio service provider		
32	or internet service provider are not liable for civil damages or criminal		
33	liability in connection with the development, design, installation,		
34	operation, maintenance, performance, release, or provision of location		
35	information or geolocation information or for any failure to timely process		
36	or release any request for location information or geolocation information as		

1	may be necessary under this subchapter.

3	12-12-1904. Providers to submit contact information to Arkansas Crime		
4	Information Center.		
5	A commercial mobile radio service provider or internet service provider		
6	either authorized to do business in the state or that has submitted to the		
7	jurisdiction of the state shall immediately submit all contact information to		
8	the Arkansas Crime Information Center and shall immediately update the		
9	contact information as changes occur.

11	12-12-1905. Additional duties of Arkansas Crime Information Center.		
12	The Arkansas Crime Information Center shall make available the contact		
13	information obtained under § 12-12-1904 on at least a quarterly basis or		
14	immediately as changes occur to each public safety agency in the state.		
15			
16	12-12-1906. Prohibition against abuse.		
17	(a) A commercial mobile radio service provider or internet service		
18	provider that believes their requirements under this subchapter are being		
19	abused by a law enforcement agency or a specific law enforcement officer may		
20	report the suspected abuse to the Department of Arkansas State Police for		
21	further investigation.		
22	(b) If the law enforcement agency that the commercial mobile radio		
23	service provider or internet service provider believes is abusing the		
24	requirements of this subchapter is the Department of Arkansas State Police,		
25	the commercial mobile radio service provider or internet service provider may		
26	report the suspected abuse to the Attorney General.		
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
